stewarding your gifts

Here at St. Mary, we manage two major sources of income: *Sunday Collections* and the *Annual Fund*, which fund the vast majority of parish operations. In addition, we receive individual gifts that are for more specific programs or ministries. Some of the programs that are frequent recipients of these donations include Faith Doing Justice, Hispanic/Latino Ministry, and Alternative Spring Break.

Sunday Collections

Sunday Collections include all offerings received at our six Sunday masses, which is a blend of offering envelopes, checks, and loose cash. They also include online donations specifically noted for Sunday Collections, which is electronically transferred weekly, monthly, and sometimes annually. Donations to Sunday Collections can also be made through the Venmo app.

Support for Sunday Collections is provided by parishioners, students, and any visitors attending mass.

Annual Fund

Campus Ministry donations received outside of Sunday Collections are placed into the Annual Fund. This includes March Match Madness, year-end donations, appeals to alumni and parents outside of Ann Arbor, and more.

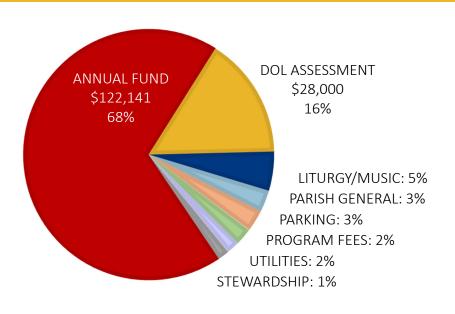

a deeper look at our net loss

We wrapped up the 2018-2019 fiscal year with a net loss of \$172,099. The graph at right displays how we reached this loss. The largest line item is attributed to fundraising. We were \$122,141 short of our annual fund goal. Next, our assessment from the Diocese of Lansing (DOL) was \$28,000 higher than budgeted. The remaining sources of our net loss were minimal, ranging from one to five percent, spread between various parish expenses.

This loss was off-set by a generous, one-time estate gift in the amount of \$232,146.



capital projects highlight: slate roof





Through the use of capital reserves, a large anonymous donation, an estate gift, and funds raised through Witness to Hope, the diocesan capital campaign, a new slate roof was installed on the church during the summer of 2019. Because this line item falls between fiscal years we have chosen to include it in this year's 2018-2019 annual report. Photos above show the scope and scale of this massive job which should last another 100 years. The chart below provides a breakdown of expenses:

This project was completed for \$23,475 below budget. This savings is due to the careful attention to detail and in-house work executed by Gary Pearce, operations manager, which saved the parish \$7,785, and unknowns which came in well below the \$40,000 reserve.
