St Mary Student Parish

For my first communion, an aunt gave me a silver locket which contained a small silver rosary—a treasure I quickly lost as the clasp on the locket was weak. I also received from my godmother a glass rosary, one that fascinated me due to its multicolored beads. I longed to have her return it to me when she took it to have a priest bless it; finally, after what seemed years, she returned the now sanctified rosary to me. My depth of feeling for this particular sacramental was largely a result of my love of the pretty glass beads rather than that for prayer.

Even though I went to Catholic schools through college, saying the rosary was not part of my prayer life. I witnessed the liturgical changes from Vatican II when I was in second grade, so did not experience many of the traditional Catholic practices that those older than I did: litanies, forty-hour devotions, novenas, eucharistic adoration, and group recitations of the rosary. I imagine that these prayer practices were still occurring somewhere, but I had not the motivation to learn about and participate in them. In my transition from childhood to adulthood, I came to see these prayer practices as vaguely superstitious artifacts of a past era that were not terribly relevant for the complexities of the current day.

Yet, somehow after many years, I ended up leading a rosary group at St. Mary's. Initially, I joined the group that my friend, Laura, began. When she graduated and moved away, I led the group and did so until Covid shut down face-to-face meetings. When we were again able to meet as a faith community, I hesitated before restarting a group recitation of the rosary. Would anyone want to gather with Covid contagion still a possibility? Would I? However, with the ongoing suffering from the recent outbreak of the Ukrainian war, I decided that now was the time to restart the rosary group at St. Mary's.

The question remains: why am I reciting (and leading a group to recite) the rosary? I have to say that this question still puzzles me—and then does not. I am a product of my

generation and my training: a skeptical academic and baby boomer who believes in an all-loving, forgiving God, rather than a God with a checklist on a celestial clipboard listing the number of rosaries I have said. My turn towards the rosary was not due to habit or obedience; it came instead from a deep need to DO something to help bring peace, and from a belief that our Blessed Mother always hears us in our sincere need. My recitations are never perfect—I'm often distracted or tired, or my effort to focus is lacking—yet I show up and trust whatever effort I am able to make is another opening for God's love to enter our beautiful, troubled and messy world.

Perhaps you have your own history with the rosary. I invite you to share it as you join in our weekly recitation at St. Mary's immediately after the Monday daily mass. Together let's pray for peace.

CAN RCIA HELP?

Deep in our hearts, we have a longing to be closer to God, to feel that we have a home with him for all eternity. St. Augustine reminds us, "Our hearts are restless until they find rest in you."

The RCIA journey at St. Mary Student Parish is designed to help people hear and respond to God's loving call – and especially to his invitation for a deeper relationship with him in the tradition of the Catholic faith. The weekly sessions are designed for:

- ✠ Those who want to be baptized in the Catholic faith.
- ✠ Those who want to join the Catholic Church from another faith or another Christian tradition.
- ✠ Baptized Catholics who wish to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Throughout the year, participants in RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) are welcome to explore and ask questions as they discern where God may be leading them.

RCIA sessions will begin formally in September, but inquirers are welcome anytime to talk. There's no pressure or obligation, we are happy to meet with you personally to discuss where you are in this faith journey and what God might be calling you to explore.

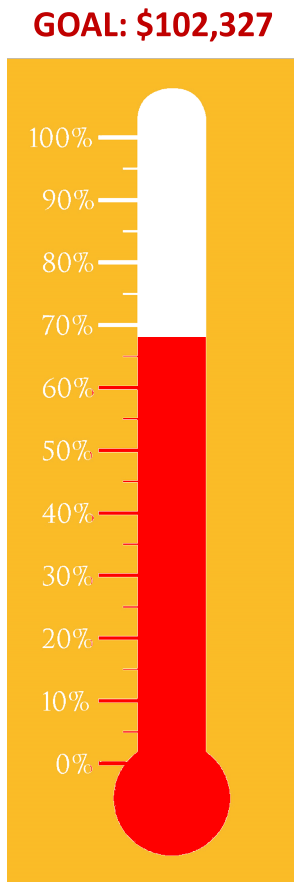

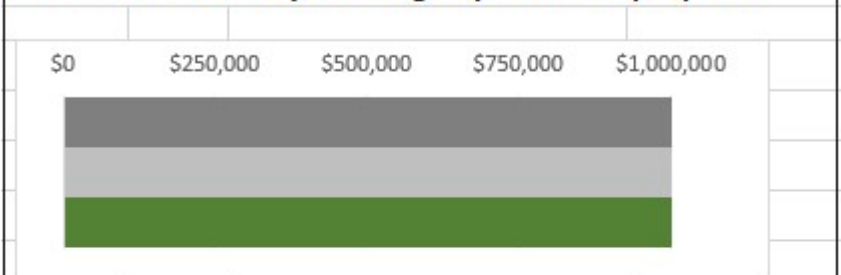
