MAKING ICE

A few years ago I got a birthday card from a friend who is about my age. The front showed a refrigerator with gurgles and 'pings' coming out of it, and the caption around it read: "You know those strange noises refrigerators give out when they're making ice. . . ." On the inside is a picture of an old man awkwardly trying to get out of his dumpy old chair, with

his joints loudly cracking; the caption reads: "Let's not say we're getting older; let's say we're 'making ice."

Those of you who are at or approaching that 'making ice' stage of life can perhaps best appreciate the fact that I asked our provincial superior to allow me to move to our retirement center, Colombiere, in Clarkston, MI, and I'm very happy that he accepted that request. I will move there in September, in time for the Fall colors.

It's hard for me to believe that I'm ending my 11th year here at St. Mary – that's a sign of how much I've enjoyed meeting all of you and sharing important moments in the life of your faith and of your family. I came originally just to help out with the large schedule of weekend Masses but pretty quickly there were daily Masses, and funerals, and weddings, and Into The Light group, and a Summer Film Festival, and a lot of spiritual direction, especially accompanying people through an eight-month version of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola.

After a couple of years here, one of the parishioners, knowing of my interest in collecting stamps, told me of a 'museum quality' stamp collection up near Alpena and he got me in to see it. For the last seven years I've split my time, one week here at St. Mary and one week up there, helping the not-for-profit group inventory collections not only of stamps but ancient coins, cameras, autographs, and a twentythousand volume library of mostly very old books. That has been an adventure, discovering something of interest almost every time I was there.

And I have had a chance to develop a life-long enjoyment of poetry, normally finding a poem with which to end Sunday homilies. It began by simply once or twice using a poem in a homily and seeing that a number of people in the congregation mentioned how much they enjoyed that, as we shook hands after Mass in those carefree, pre-pandemic days. It only gradually dawned on me how poetry helped to see a passage from Scripture in a different and helpful light. It became something like using parables, as Jesus did, to give a concrete example of an insight.

Recently, I read a comment by Pope Francis about poetry that confirmed for me my practice. In his letter of response to the Amazon Synod, Francis quoted with praise a line from the Brazilian poet Vinicius de Moraes: "Only poetry, with its humble voice, will be able to save this world."

Many, many thanks for all we have been able to do together these past years. Please remember me in your prayers, as I will pray for you. And may God allow all of us to continue "making ice"!

CATHOLIC 101: CHURCH TEACHING AND THE ANTI-RACISM MOVEMENT

This article <u>https://thejesuitpost.org/2020/07/</u> <u>catholic-101-should-a-catholic-be-an-antiracist/</u> published by the Jesuit Post on July 30th tackles common questions asked by Catholics and provides answers rooted in church teaching.

Questions the article addresses include:

- What is racism? And what is the Catholic Church's stance on it?
- What does Catholic teaching have to say about "systemic racism"? How can an institution or a system by racist? Isn't the problem racist people?
- What about this idea of "implicit bias"? I don't understand how I could be doing something racist when I'm not trying to be racist.
- What does it mean to be "anti-racist"?
- What would the Church say about reparations for past injustices, such as for slavery? Slavery ended 155 years ago in the United States. Why don't we just try to treat everyone equally moving forward, and perhaps even place stronger laws in the books for that, instead of punishing people in the present for the sins of the past?
- Even if I agree with the principals of anti-racism and justice, it seems like this will require a massive amount of effort from our country. Is it really worth it when there are so many other important issues?


