Parish Insight



SONGS I DON'T LIKE

Way back in 1990, Bette Midler recorded a song that become a major hit titled "From a Distance." Overall, the song was a harmless and sugary song about how, from a physical and metaphorical distance, the earth and all of us on it blend together with a harmony that permits us to see the possibility of peace and a shared belief in the common good. "From a distance, you look like my friend, even though we are at war," Midler crooned, reminiscent, perhaps, of John Lennon inviting us all to "imagine all the people livin' life in peace."

But John Lennon started off by asking us also to "imagine there's no heaven." Bette Midler, on the other hand, asserted the presence of God, but-and this was always my objection-"from a distance." From the very first time I heard that song back in 1990, I absolutely hated it! "God is watching us, watching us from a distance," Medler insisted, as I shouted in response, "No! No! No! God is not 'watching from a distance!'" God is here! Present among us! And not simply watching, but working, straining, loving, always present, always in our midst. Catholic author Fr. Ronald Rolheiser distinguishes between a theist, one who believes in a creator-God that has essentially left us on our own, and a Christian who believes in the incarnation. And through the incarnation, God took on human flesh to live among us, because we as human beings, can only experience Godexperience anything, really-through touch, and taste, and sight, and sound, and smell.

Maybe what we most forget, though, is that the incarnation was not merely an event that took place 2000 years ago. The incarnation continues now, through all of us. After the resurrection and the ascension, Jesus continued his incarnate presence on the earth by making us his body. "Now you are the body of Christ, and individually parts of it," Paul tells us (1 Cor 12:27), but it would be a mistake for us to think of this as a metaphor. He means what he says: We are Christ's body *now*. Far from watching us "from a distance," God has blessed us with the gift of being the presence of Christ on earth *now*. "Christ has no body now but yours," famously wrote St. Teresa of Avila.

As we begin again the season of Advent and prepare to celebrate the incarnation, let's not make the mistake of thinking we're simply commemorating a singular event that occurred 2000 years ago. Instead, we celebrate a new era that *began* 2000 years ago and continues through this day, through us, in us, and for us. God is not watching us from a distance; God is inviting us to renew our own calling to be Christ's very presence in our world today. And our world today is in sore in need of it.

Shelter of Flint : Shelter of Flint manages hundreds of properties in Flint and offers a full range of programs that support families in need.


2021-2022 Summary for Annual Report

St. Mary operates on fiscal year of July 1 through June 30. We ended the 2021-2022 fiscal year with net income of \$112,468, however that did include \$11,881 from employee retention credits that we were eligible for due to the pandemic.

Revenue (not including the retention credits) was \$100,588 lower than budget and overall expenses were \$201,175 less than budget. Donations to Sunday offering and the annual fund were higher than budgeted while other sources of revenue were lower than budgeted. While the majority of savings in expenses can be attributed to lower staff costs, we also experienced savings in programming costs as we were not fully open for a good portion of the year due to COVID-19. We did spend some of these savings on replacing the oven/stove in the kitchen in Newman Hall and also replacing more our computers sooner than scheduled.

We are so appreciative to have had two fiscal years in a row with a positive net income (2020-2021 net income without the PPP loan forgiveness was \$128,662). We were again grateful and humbled by the fact that donations to Sunday offering and the annual fund remained strong during the pandemic. We look forward to seeing what happens in the 2022-2023 fiscal year.

We are already enjoying offering more programming as it feels like we are establishing a new "normal" as students and parishioners return to St. Mary. Thank you!
