

Why is the music during the Liturgy of the Eucharist changing

With the change of each liturgical season, our church is draped in different colors. This week we will see a shift from the green of Ordinary Time to the purple of Advent and eventually white of Christmas. In an effort to join the rest of the Church, we will be marking the change in the season in a musical way, too. During Ordinary Time we have been singing "Mass for the Life of the World" by David Haas. Now, during the Advent and Christmas seasons, we will be singing "Mass of Creation" by Marty Haugen, a piece that can be found in the Gather hymnal (starting at #192) and is commonly sung at Catholic parishes throughout the United States.

Why does it seem like I hear the same Psalms over and over? Why doesn't the Psalm match the one in the missalette?

We are blessed to have many resources for musical choices here at St. Mary Student Parish. However, we do not have a musical setting of each of the 150 psalms (and even if we do, that doesn't guarantee they are of the highest quality that we prefer). Instead, it is possible for a "Common Psalm" to be sung in place of the dictated psalm (these common psalms are often suggested within the missalette itself). These "Common Psalms" include Psalm 27: The Lord Is My Light and My Salvation, Psalm 34: Taste and See, and Psalm 103: The Lord Is Kind and Merciful.

Why can't we start Christmas carols yet?

Christmas carols are coming, don't worry! However, there are so many great Advent carols that we will be highlighting over the next four weeks during the season of Advent. We will celebrate Christmas during the 12 weeks of the Christmas liturgical season.
