"WELCOME THE NEWCOMER"

U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) have released several statements regarding developments with the Trump Administration's efforts to limit refugees and immigrants coming to the U.S.

Most recently, the Bishops responded to a federal appeals court ruling that stops the president's executive order temporarily. In response to the Appeals Court ruling, Bishop Joe Vasquez, Chair of the Committee on Migration, stated:

"We welcome the decision of the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals ... We remain steadfast in our commitment to resettling refugees and all those fleeing persecution. At this time, we remain particularly dedicated to ensuring that affected refugee and immigrant families are not separated and that they continue to be welcomed to our country. We will continue to welcome the newcomer as it is a vital part of our Catholic faith and an enduring element of our American values and tradition."

"When did we see you a stranger and welcome you?" Matthew 25:38

The following USCCB Statement was issued on Jan. 30:

" ... We call upon all the Catholic faithful to join us as we unite our voices with all who speak in defense of human dignity. The bond between Christians and Muslims is founded on the unbreakable strength of charity and justice... The Church will not waver in her defense of our sisters and brothers of all faiths who suffer at the hands of merciless persecutors.

The refugees fleeing from ISIS and other extremists are sacrificing all they have in the name of peace and freedom. Often, they could be spared if only they surrendered to the violent vision of their tormentors. They stand firm in their faith. Many are families, no different from yours or mine, seeking safety and security for their children. Our nation should welcome them as allies in a common fight against evil. We must screen vigilantly for infiltrators who would do us harm, but we must always be equally vigilant in our welcome of friends.

Our desire is not to enter the political arena, but rather to proclaim Christ alive in the world today. In the very moment a family abandons their home under threat of death, Jesus is present. And He says to each of us, "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (MT 25:40).

In addition, Jesuit leaders in the United States and Canada have issued a similar statement.

"As members of a global religious order that works to form men and women of conscience and compassion, we denounce the Trump Administration's Executive Order suspending and barring refugees and banning nationals of seven countries as an affront to our mission and an assault on American and Christian values.

The Jesuits — through our work in high schools, colleges, parishes and signature ministries such as Jesuit Refugee Service — have a long, proud tradition of welcoming and accompanying refugees, regardless of their religion, as they begin their new lives in the United States. We will continue that work, defending and standing in solidarity with all children of God, whether Muslim or Christian.

The world is deeply troubled, and many of our brothers and sisters are justifiably terrified. Our Catholic and Jesuit identity calls us to welcome the stranger and to approach different faith traditions and cultures with openness and understanding. We must not give in to fear. We must continue to defend human rights and religious liberty. As Pope Francis said, "You cannot be a Christian without living like a Christian."


