TRANSFORMED FOR LIFE

This week we asked two undergraduate students to reflect on their Alternative Spring Break experiences.

We worked with a number of different groups, but interacting with incarcerated individuals and the local community was the most powerful part for me. During our prison visits, I met kids like Elijah and Steven, who were only teenagers possibly facing life in prison or the death penalty, but still maintained hope.

We also frequently interacted with the Delores community, which primarily consists of immigrants. I've never witnessed a finer community. Their generosity and hospitality was remarkable, especially given the significant uncertainty surrounding their future.

My homestay with a local family undoubtedly demonstrated this. My host family's mother, Ana, gave our group so much even though they didn't have a lot.

There were a number of others who represented Christ and were beacons of hope along the way. Pastor of the Delores Mission, Fr. Ted, tirelessly serves his parish; Mike at Homeboy Industries represents hope for so many; and Richard and Javier at the men's jail who, despite long sentences, have committed to educating themselves. Javier is even learning law and serving as his own legal coun-

sel. All of these individuals continue to serve as inspiration.

After my trip, how exactly to utilize this inspiration remained a question. Last week I had the privilege of listening to Bryan Stevenson, founder of the Equal Justice Initiative, outline a tremendous strategy for change. He said you have to get proximate, you must do uncomfortable things, you must maintain hope, and you need to change the narrative. So far, I have done the first three and I hope this reflection helps to accomplish the last

The timing of this trip was perfect. Refugees have been a hot topic and one I didn't understand well. While I felt that we should welcome them into America, I didn't have any understanding of the vastness of the situation. We learned that it takes 15 years on average for a refugee to be approved, and family members aren't always placed in the same country. In fact, only 1 percent of the world's refugees are ever placed in a final country. They say ASB is life changing and it'll break your heart, but I really had no idea.

We assisted in an adult ESL class working with refugees. I was working with Michael, a Cuban who was struggling to understand me. He turned to me with such hope in his eyes and said, "Do you speak Spanish?" Disappointed in myself and our country, I said "No, I don't". Afterwards, I turned to Evan, a fellow participant and said, "I want to drop out and teach ESL." We laughed it off, but it stuck with me. An entire community in our country speaks this language that I haven't bothered to learn. I've been so insensitive. I've learned French and German, but not Spanish, the second most spoken language in our country.

I knew from that moment that God was calling me to change some things in my life. And isn't that what ASB is about? Finding God in both the people you meet and yourself? For His world is hurting and it's up to us to take the gifts He has given us and use them.


