

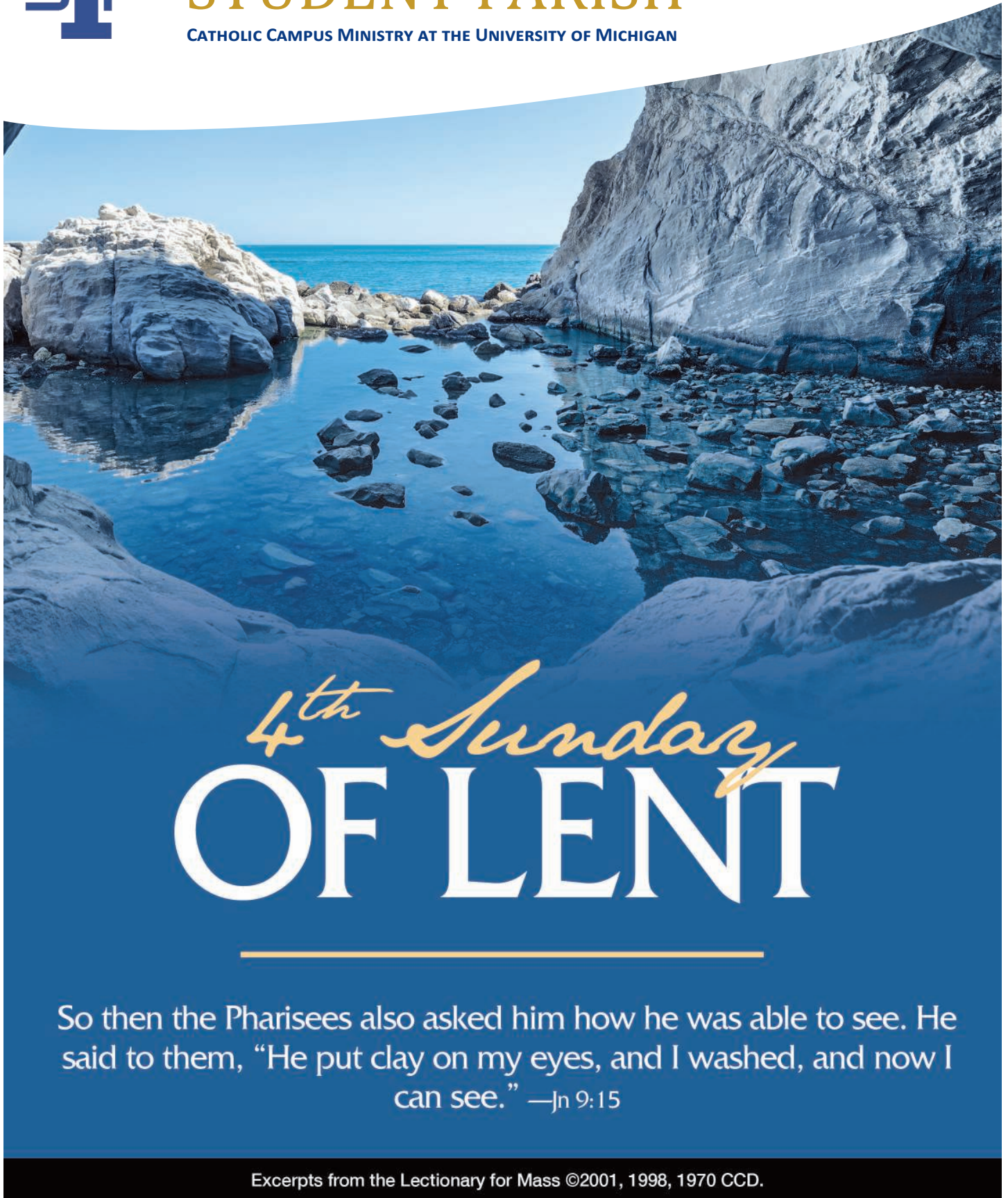

So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, “He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see.” —Jn 9:15

GOD, GRANT US SIGHT

The long form of this Sunday's gospel is a doozy: we follow the blind man who is healed from Jesus to the Pool of Siloam to his neighbors to the Pharisees. After a drawn-out line of questioning involving his parents and trick questions, we're left wondering what that was all about.

And because of the richness of this week's text, we also have a variety of ways to interpret our text: we might examine all the reasons people give for why Jesus is or isn't from God, the loaded question about whether the blind man or his parents sinned, how the blind man is healed only to see corruption all around him before he sees Jesus for who he is, or even the contrasting examples of thoroughness we find in Samuel the prophet and the Pharisees.

Long story short, we learn at least one thing when we take a step back: that any encounter with God has a lot to it. Too much, in fact, to say anything satisfying in a few minutes or paragraphs.

One last lens that is helpful, especially in this Lenten season, is sin: whose sin caused all this? And is Jesus a sinner, or the Pharisees? The more time we spend with this text, the more we can dig into the levels of sin at work.

St. Ignatius teaches the same lesson to everyone who undertakes the Spiritual Exercises. We, too, are a rich text, but one where many levels of sin

can be found. Most of the First Week of the Exercises is a long and slow meditation on one's sinfulness in all the forms it can take:

Original sin is the web of sin we're caught in. It conditions our view on the world and leaves us thinking we can fend for ourselves without God.

Personal sin is all the ways we have intentionally chosen to walk away from the Lord.

Social sin is the many and subtle ways we treat other people as less than images of God: skintone-based privilege, the excess of space and clothing that we deny to the homeless, oil consumption that destroys our Common Home, and the production of most clothing by slave labor.

Repeated sins are the painful areas where we continue to fall, yet might not realize it; they are the ways in which we habitually fail to respect the dignity of God and others.

Dwelling on all these dimensions of one's own sinful past over hours and days is painful, to put it lightly. Over the course of a week, it leaves us looking for a respite — and God is the only sufficient source of mercy.

As we continue to hear Jesus calling to us, let us be unafraid to see all the sin that surrounds us and permeates us, trusting that it "is so that the works of God might be made visible." He is willing to grant us sight, trusting that we will see him for what he is — the Lord.

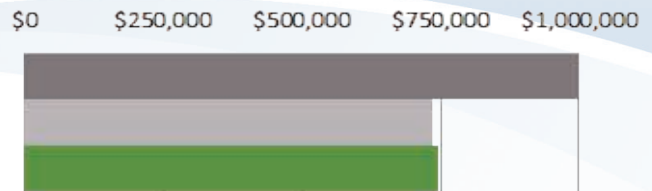

Year-to-Date Offering Report as of 3/19/2017

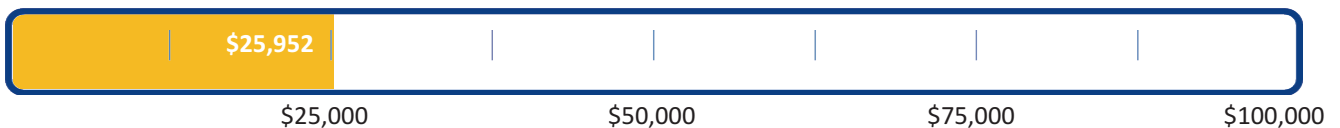
