

### **Pastoral Perspective**

### I BELIEVE

It's a joy to be able to assist our 8<sup>th</sup>-graders (and some older students) in preparing for Confirmation. Each session, we do some faith sharing, some prayer and some learning activities.

One of their recent assignments was to study the Nicene Creed, then create a "creed project" outlining their own beliefs. Their statements of faith overwhelmed me, so I thought I'd share some of them.

Most students said they believe in God, and in the Trinity. One student said that she sees God mostly in the love that surrounds her.

The hardest thing about our faith?
Believing that Jesus performed miracles that seem impossible; believing and understanding that the Eucharist is Jesus. The most natural thing?
Believing that God is all around us, and knowing that God wants us to help others.

Here are a few other insights and excerpts:

- God wants us to follow the commandments.
- Be good to others, and to ourselves.
- God will always be with you, it is important to maintain a relationship with God. You do not have to be perfect.
- I like the feeling of community that comes with the Catholic faith.
- I believe in the Holy Spirit, the living fire of God inside each of us, guiding us away from sin.

- I believe in a unified, loving, accepting, peaceful and merciful church that keeps God's teachings and the Catholic faith alive.
- I believe Jesus loves me over everything, just as much as I love him over everything. I believe prayer is a strong, truthful way of becoming closer to God and to increase your trust with him.
- I believe in the power of faith and love, of mercy, kindness and acceptance; of tolerance, of empathy.
- I believe in peace and equality, and the power of God to bring it about.




