

### **Pastoral Perspective**

## "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAVE YOU FORSAKEN ME?"

According to Matthew, those are the last words of Jesus before he died. To some, they seem scandalous. How could Jesus, of all people, accuse God of having forsaken him? Surely, he didn't really mean that, did he? Some like to point out that Jesus was invoking the words of Psalm 22, a Psalm that begins in desolation but ends with the confident hope of God's deliverance. But, of course, Jesus didn't cry out the words of deliverance; he cried out the words of pain.

Personally, I tend to think that Jesus said what he said because it reflected exactly what he felt. How could anyone feel otherwise in the midst of one of the most excruciating deaths imaginable? He said what he said because, as we believe as Christians, he was both fully divine *and* fully human. And if he was fully human, he *had* to feel what he did, because we all do. He could not take on the full weight of our sinful and broken humanity without experiencing the kind of desolation that surely touches all of our lives at one time or another.

Maybe the most important thing to keep in mind, though, is that these words of Jesus are directed to God; they are a *prayer*. He may have felt forsaken or abandoned, but he did not give up on God. Even in the midst of his darkness, even in his experience of forsakenness, he was still crying out to God, regardless of how distant God may have felt to him. And in doing so, he permits us to follow his example: We, too, never need to fear expressing to God in prayer exactly what we feel, even if those feelings may scandalize us. In the worst darkness that life can throw at us, God knows our pain, and God even knows that He can be very hard to believe in sometimes. And yet, as they were for Jesus, even our cries of pain are prayer, and perhaps some of the most heartfelt expressions of faith we might ever offer.

As we listen to Jesus's words today, we know, of course, that his vindication would come. It *did* come. And it will come to each one of us in God's time and in God's way. But that celebration will take place next week. In the meantime, the Church invites us to spend this week recalling the events that led to Jesus's final words, and to see in those events a reflection of the experiences of pain and darkness of our own lives. It is by entering into the mysterious depths of this week—the *Paschal Mystery* that we find the courage to hope in our own final salvation.

We call this week *Holy*. Enter into it. Let it transform you. Let this holy week be different from all others.

# Please Welcome CRISTIAN ANDRÉS CONTRERAS LAZO, S.J.



Fr. Cristian is a Jesuit priest from Chile, who will join us later this summer for the next academic year. He will be studying English and also participating in liturgical ministries here at St. Mary Student Parish. Cristian was born in Santiago, Chile, on October 26, 1979. He is the son of Violeta and Eddie and the third of

three sons. His brothers are Eddy and Iván, who are married to Paola and Andrea, respectively. He has four nieces and nephews: Fernanda, Ignacio, Benjamín, and Martín. Until he was 21 years old he lived with his family in the town of Colina, near the capital. After his primary and secondary schooling, he entered the university and studied Construction Management.

At 15 years old, he signed up for the confirmation process in his parish of Immaculate Conception in Colina, at which time he began to think about the meaning of life and a call from God to religious life. After a time of discernment, he entered the novitiate of the Society of Jesus in the town of Melipilla on March 18, 2001. During these years in the Society, he has served in diverse apostolates: the St. Joaquina de Vedruna de Huilco Community in Melipilla; Santa Cruz Parish in Estación Central; Colegio San Luis (a high school) in the city of Antofagasta (in the middle of the Atacama desert); in the Arica Mission of the Jesuits (on the Peruvian border); and in the Hogar de Cristo (the Home of Christ, founded by St. Alberto Hurtado, SJ). Currently, he is the vicar of San Ignacio de Loyola Parish (on the outskirts of Santiago).

He was ordained a deacon on June 29, 2013, and ordained a priest on December 13 of the same year.
