AN OPEN LETTER OF GRATITUDE

Dear Parishioners,

Looking back on the 2016-2017 academic year, I am left amazed beyond words at what God has done through the ministries of St. Mary Student Parish. If there's one thing I don't want to get lost in all of this-and -that, it's that very little could happen without the collective efforts of hundreds of volunteers. You have been instrumental in accomplishing what nobody would have thought possible a very short time ago.

To just run six masses each Sunday that offer incredible liturgical arts, care for students and parishioners, guest services, and technical support is a monumental accomplishment on its own. Yet, our volunteers minister beyond our liturgy to the greater community through social justice, outreach, and so much more.

Here are just a few of the milestones completed through our collective body in the past year:

- 86 guests received much needed supplies from our January warming center gift registry, with at least 100 parishioners serving in-person at the shelter or donating supplies
- 110 undergrads served across 13 sites during Alternative Spring Break
- 45 students celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation, with 12 undergrads serving as student catechists

- 209 parishioners participated in our annual Feast Day of Service, serving 13 local organizations like the Salvation Army, Alpha House, and Habitat for Humanity
- 16 individuals deepened their walk with Christ and received sacraments through RCIA supported by 89+ volunteers for the Triduum Liturgies

God willing, this privilege will continue into the 2017-2018 academic year, and we'll look back saying much of the same. Not what "we have done" but rather "look what God has done through his people." Look again at the lives changed, relationships built, and the stories of God's faithfulness through your impact in this last year. Revisit those events and examine for yourself what happens every week, discover where God is at work in your lives.

Thank you for your tireless efforts, for your intentionality in serving our mission. Thank you for giving time, for putting aside self for others. There is no better definition of love than when one serves. Thank you for leading and for your impact - much of which you don't even know about. This could not happen without God's purposing through you.

Your staff is honored, your church is blessed, but more than anything, Christ is being made known at all of these touch points because of the ministry of His people - you. In God's Love,

CENTERING PRAYER

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book <u>Open Heart, Open Mind</u> by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.
