HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY AND WELCOME TO SUMMER!

Now that exams are over for students, our staff can breathe a collective sigh of relief along with them. Summer is upon us, or at least it's close. And May is here, which means we take time to remember our mothers at home on Mother's Day and our Heavenly Mother, Mary.

May and Mary bring fond memories for me. In grade school, each May, almost every student would bring flowers from home for our annual Mary Day Mass. I would beg my mom to let me cut some of her hydrangeas instead of getting flowers from the store. Something about bringing flowers inspired devotion in me as a child, though I learned a better lesson from Mary this time of year just a few years ago.

As I was trying to learn how to pray toward the end of college, I turned toward the rosary. It was both familiar and foreign: I knew it well from my education in a parochial school, yet I had never found it to be the source of insights or freshness that I expected from prayer.

I would pray it walking to and from campus; the twenty-minute walk was the perfect time to make it through all five decades. And I would shove my rosary into my pocket if I happened upon a friend of mine, embarrassed at what they might think.

Against my expectations, I found myself reflecting not on events from 2,000 years ago, but on my relationship with my own mom. I sat with Mary, reflecting on how she may have felt about her only son being far from home, on the road, without shelter, in the thick of religious conversations. That was a good dose of reality for how my own mom felt about me becoming a Jesuit: I'm the oldest of two, and as a Jesuit I would almost always be far from home, on the road, even out of the country, in places she's never dreamed about nor been concerned with.

A good dose of reality. I don't think most modern Catholics would think of the rosary that way, but that was what the Lord gifted me in those months that are crucial to the story of my vocation, even today.

Now, as this semester ends and I return to St. Paul, Minnesota, SMSP has also become a part of my vocation story. When I entered the novitiate two years ago in August, I couldn't see myself working at a parish, yet here I am! The Lord works in mysterious ways. Thank you, all of you, for making this a blessed and educative experience. So many of

you have been companions to me this semester.

My time as a Jesuit novice will come to an end August 12 when I profess perpetual vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, God willing. I ask that you please pray for me and my classmates, that we may always follow wherever the Lord leads us.

BAPTISM CLASS

5/22, 6/26, 7/31 -attend one class only

On the last Monday of every month (occasionally, the date is changed due to holidays, etc.), St. Mary Student Parish holds a baptism class for new parents at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up materials for the discussion from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the meeting they plan to attend. The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class. At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another.

In order to have a baptism here you either need to be registered here OR get permission from the church where you are registered. We do Sunday baptisms during the mass and are celebrated by the priest. Only one child may be baptized per mass on Sundays. Spanish Baptisms are usually scheduled every other Sunday after the 2pm Spanish mass at 3:15. Three children can be baptized after the Spanish Mass.


LGBT OUTREACH
