Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book <u>Open Heart, Open Mind</u> by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

Programs

They offer a variety of programs including literacy, computer training, work development and life skills development. A new nutrition program was added to address needs from the water crisis.

Community

They provide services to the local community including a food pantry, hot meal program, Christmas giveaway, water distribution site and a donation center for clothing and household items.

Social Enterprise

They operate several businesses that employ program graduates and give them the opportunity to become self-sufficient. They are job creators, and the types of jobs they create save and change lives.

St. Mary has a long standing relationship with St. Luke N.E.W. Life Center. Our Alternative Spring Break students and Flint Family Service Trip participants have worked at the Center for several years. We have also supported them through our Advent Giving Tree program. From a Drug House to a New Life Rachel's Story

I can't even begin to describe what the N.E.W. Life Center has done for me! Its Life Change program guided me to work on self-esteem building, anger management, personal care, exercise and even volleyball. They also taught me basic life skills like cooking, gardening and simple home repair, plus CPR, parenting, nutrition, budgeting, job searching and basic computer skills.

"I earned my GED, and now I'm taking college courses Mondays and Wednesdays. They helped me regain parenting rights for daughter, and now they take care of my two daughters when I'm at class. In addition to school, I work in the N.E.W. Life Center Food Pantry on Tuesdays and Thursdays – packing and distributing bags of food.

Every worker here has a story, and we're all here for each other through thick and thin. We keep each other safe and give each other support that none of us ever had before. You can't understand how important it is to be surrounded by good, loving people when you're trying to come back from a life like I had!




From Poverty to a New Life Kapus' Story


Kapus was born and raised in Flint, graduated from Flint Northern in the early 2000s and joined the Army as a combat medic. When he completed his commitment to the Army, he expected life to become easier but the opposite became true.

Kapus returned to his home town to find no opportunity for work. A caseworker suggested Kapus volunteer at NLC, there he found doors start to open, "N.E.W. Life gave me a chance to do what I was good at, and they put me in contact with people to get my life moving in the right direction."

Kapus completed pre-employment training at NLC and spent the summer of 2016 working in the lawn care social enterprise. There he demonstrated his skills and commitment to hard work. NLC helped Kapus secure a job with Goyette Mechanical in Flint. He is now working full-time as a member of the Plumbers/Pipefitters union. We at NLC feel blessed to have Kapus in our lives and a part of our story. "What I can say is, N.E.W. Life did exactly what the name says, they gave me hope. They shed a lot of light on my darkness."

Initiated by two Roman Catholic nuns in 2002, the St. Luke N.E.W. (North End Womens) Life Center (NLC) is a faith-based nonprofit organization that offers services to structurally unemployed men and women in the north end of Flint, Michigan. The NLC offers transformational programs that provide life skills, education, and workforce training to help individuals become more self-sufficient and support their families. NLC staff is committed to building trusting and enduring relationships with families who receive assistance through their programs. In order to receive support from NLC, an individual must have a genuine desire to change his or her situation and must regularly participate in activities for the duration of the program in which he or she is enrolled.

NLC also contains microenterprises in culinary arts, clothing manufacturing, and landscaping. These small businesses serve as places of employment for NLC program graduates, putting men and women on a path to financial stability based on the job and life skills gained at the NLC.

Active Program participants and neighborhood residents also have access to wrap-around support services and training such as food and clothing distribution, childcare, and literacy/high school completion assistance.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is a pledge?

A pledge is a good-faith promise that offers you a way to be generous over a period of time. Pledges are not legally binding.

When will I receive reminders to make payments on my pledge?

Unless you indicate that you would like a later start date on your pledge card, you will begin receiving reminders a few weeks after you make your pledge. You can choose whether to receive those reminders on a monthly, quarterly, or annual basis.

Is it possible to set up automatic payments for my pledge?

Yes, some donors set up automatic bank draft or credit card payments. Some also send checks or transfer stock.

To whom should checks be made?

Checks should be made out to "Witness to Hope."
