

Pastoral Perspective

PRAY FOR US, O HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

To consecrate something is to set it apart from its ordinary use or place in the world, and to dedicate it exclusively to God's use and God's purpose. People may be consecrated as well, and, in fact, all Christians are consecrated to God at our Baptismset apart as children of God and disciples of Jesus. Indeed, we might think of our baptismal call to be set apart as the call to conform ourselves less and less to the ways of our culture and society, and more and more to the ways of Jesus. Throughout our lives, we are taught, sometimes subtly and often not so subtly, what we should think, what we should feel, what we should believe, and what we ought to value. Our Christian call is to challenge our own thoughts, feelings, beliefs, and values, by looking always more closely at the thoughts, the feelings, the beliefs, the values of Jesus. In a world in which we have become so divided, the path toward unity is the path not toward conformity with one another, but toward conformity to Christ.

Throughout Christian history, we have held up role models for ourselves in the Church because of what their lives or their teachings tell us about becoming more and more like Jesus. Our preeminent model is Mary, the one among all human beings who most closely conformed her own life to Christ. It was Mary who asked God, "Let it be done unto me according to your word," anticipating Jesus' own prayer, "Thy will be done." And it was Mary who sang, "My being proclaims the greatness of the Lord," anticipating Jesus' call to all of us to proclaim his Good News.

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the appearance of Our Lady to three young children in Fatima, Portugal. In recognition of this anniversary, our bishop, Earl Boyea, has asked that all parishes in the Diocese of Lansing be consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Sunday, August 13th. This will be done with a short act of prayer at the end of each mass that day. In doing so, we entrust ourselves and our parish to Mary, with the hope and the prayer that her conformity to Christ may be the model for us all. We pray for a heart like Mary's, because Mary's heart is united to the heart of Jesus.

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book <u>Open Heart, Open Mind</u> by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with

a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

Family Faith Formation (K-7th grade) The home-based program meets one Sunday a month at the parish and requires families to continue to work together at home on lessons.






SANCTUARY AND BEYOND: SUPPORTING OUR IMMIGRANT

FAMILY AUG 20 | 3:30-5:00 PM



Supporting Our Seminarians

To Strengthen Our Parish and Our Diocese

One Seminarian's Journey to Service

John Henry Keenan is one of 28 men currently in seminary for the Diocese of Lansing. Witness to Hope will provide \$3,000,000 in endowment to providing educational assistance to those studying for the priesthood in the diocese. Here is his journey toward the priesthood.



I was born in Connecticut, but my family moved to Michigan when I was eight. I spent most of my life here and attended Old St. Patrick Catholic Church. From seventh to tenth grade, I was part of a home program called St. Augustine's Homeschool Enrichment Program. For the rest of high school, I went to Washtenaw Technical Middle College, which is a program on campus of Washtenaw Community College where high schoolers take college courses. I got a certificate in video production, and I transferred to John Paul the Great University in San Diego. My plan had been to be a film director someday. I had been going to Mass and adoration daily for at least two years. It was something that my school encouraged, and it put me in a position where I was able to hear the Lord speaking to me. In the beginning of May 2014, I didn't like life where I was. I felt like I was in limbo, and I didn't know what I should be doing next.

I was asking the Lord what I ought to be doing, and I could feel he had something to tell me. I didn't expect it to be seminary.

I felt moved to continue praying, and I was in the chapel that was in our school and asking the Lord very fervently to tell me, what he wanted me to do. I heard him say very clearly to go to the seminary. It wasn't a material voice, but it was a real voice like I hadn't really experienced before.

He made clear at that moment that I didn't have to go to seminary right away. He made clear to me that I could wait a little while, but my path to him would lead through the seminary eventually. I told him, "OK, Lord. You don't have to tell me twice. I'll go."

That was in May 2014 and my first impulse was to hurry and enroll in seminary right away that fall, but when I talked to the local vocation director the first thing that he said to me, and this has been more or less a paradigm, was "You got to slow down and be patient, and listen to what the Lord is saying. You don't even know if you want to go to a diocesan seminary or a religious order."

I had a history in two dioceses, Lansing, Mich. and San Diego, Calif. He said, "You have to discern which of those you are going to enter." I respect him a lot for having the trust in the Lord and the patience to make sure guys are praying and discerning well. Our vocation director here in Lansing, Father John Linden, is very similar in that regard.

After talking to him, I initially thought I was called to join a religious order. I was still in a stage where it was patience and prayer. I had no idea where to start. I had never spent a night in a religious house or anything. I went to the Internet and typed "religious orders," found a long list of them and went from there. I eventually visited a few places around the country. I really just knew God wanted me to go to the seminary, but I had no idea what his exact plan was. I moved home to Michigan in July 2014, specifically so I could discern. I began discerning diocesan priesthood more after reading *To Save a Thousand Souls*, which focuses on diocesan priesthood, and which spoke to me deeply. That October, I went to Father John Linden's Lansing discernment group, the Foundation, and was pleasantly surprised how at home I felt talking to him and the other men there. Something just felt right about it. He said I could visit Sacred Heart Major Seminary, and it was the first place I'd been where I could see myself being there. I was ready to apply after that.

Father Linden had me take another month and a half of prayer before he would give me the application, which I respect him so tremendously for because he's all about true discernment. I did apply and I got in, and here I am in my second year. It's certainly busy. It's a full life; it's a good life. We have a lot of work to do, but it's a good environment to be doing it in.

My decision, it wasn't something I had been thinking about too much, so I think that it was through a pretty direct interaction with God. But, once I did, there were people in place to help me.
