## GOSPEL REFLECTION by Britten Megargle, Campus Minister & Jake Derry, Campus Ministry Associate

Have you ever been in the situation of needing another's help, perhaps it be in a project at work or at home, a helping hand or a kind word to cheer after a long day? Everyone has experienced this need at some point in their life. And I think that many of us have experienced the need for God's help in our life. "Lord give me wisdom to love this person", "Lord grant me the strength to handle this situation", "I need your healing presence in my life." The Canaanite woman experienced this need for Jesus. "Lord help me." Her confidence in Jesus and in his power and mercy shine through in her persistence of running to our Lord. In fact, our Lord rewards her great faith, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." Now an interesting point is that this woman was moved by love for her daughter who had been afflicted by evil spirits. However, she not only asks for healing for her daughter, but she asks for healing for herself. "Lord have pity on me." This recognition of her own need brings mercy not only to herself but to her daughter as well. I think that this is the experience that I

have had in my own life, "Lord help me, that I may help others." It is impossible for us to show God's love and mercy to others if we are not first filled with his love and mercy. "By virtue of the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy." How often I have experienced the need to call out to our Lord, "Jesus I want to bring you to others, fill me with your presence." "Jesus be a healing presence in me, that others may receive you." Mother Mary lived this experience after she received the message that she was to be the mother of the Savior. Immediately, she left all to help her cousin Elizabeth who was also with child. She who carried Christ in her went to God's merciful presence to another in her need. I believe that this is something that must form our lives. As Catholics, we are called to be the love and mercy of God to others, through acts of service and through our examples and words. In our own society, how much room is there to do good with others: to provide support to those suffering, to the immigrant, to the homeless, to the poor. Yet this mercy and this

service can be most fully provided when we first receive God's mercy and God's love in our lives. This love and mercy Jesus desires to shower out upon us, through the faith we have in his presence. Every Sunday we have the opportunity to receive his Body and Blood in Holy Communion, let this be a time to experience God's love and mercy and then to be his Love and mercy to the world.

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book Open Heart, Open Mind by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

## BAPTISM CLASS

8/21, 9/25, 10/30, 11/27, 12/11 - attend one class only

On the last Monday of every month (occasionally, the date is changed due to holidays, etc.), St. Mary Student Parish holds a baptism class for new parents from 7:00-8:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up materials for the discussion from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the meeting they plan to attend. The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class. At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another.

In order to have a baptism here you either need to be registered here OR get permission from the church where you are registered. We do Sunday baptisms during the mass and are celebrated by the priest. Only one child may be baptized per mass on Sunday at the 10am, noon or 5pm mass.

Spanish Baptisms are usually scheduled every other Sunday after the 2pm Spanish mass at 3:15. Three children can be baptized after the Spanish Mass.

We are grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism.

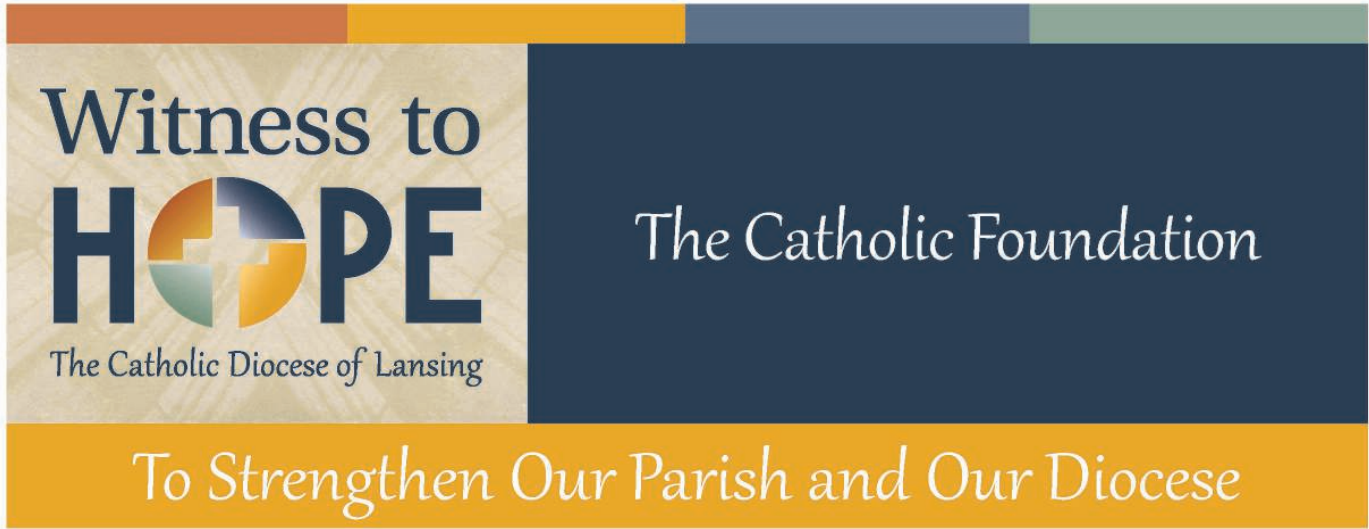

## The Catholic Foundation of the Diocese of Lansing

Established in 2016, The Catholic Foundation of the Diocese of Lansing serves parishes, schools, and other ministries by stewarding financial resources, fostering giving, and helping to provide for the Church's long-term financial needs. *Witness to Hope*, our first diocesan-wide capital campaign, is a project of The Catholic Foundation.

**Funds developed through *Witness to Hope* will be:**

- 1. Paid out by the Foundation to your parish for needs identified in the parish "case statement"; or**
- 2. Paid out by the Foundation for specific projects identified in the campaign "case statement"; or**
- 3. Administered by the Foundation in endowed funds for the long-term support of our seminarians, retired priests, Catholic schools and Catholic Charities agencies.**

The Catholic Foundation is a separate and distinct nonprofit organization under the guidance and care of Bishop Boyea. Its board of directors – appointed by Bishop Boyea – is charged with assuring the Foundation's transparency in operations and accountability to the people of the Diocese.

Deacon John Cameron, chancellor, George Landolt, chief financial officer, and Father Michael Murray, moderator of the curia and legal counsel, comprise the Foundation's initial board of directors. The board will be expanded to include individuals from across the Diocese with experience

and professional expertise relevant to the operations, development, and oversight of the Foundation.

The Foundation's day-to-day activities are led by John Madigan, executive director, who was recently appointed after a formal search. John has practiced law, served as vice president and general counsel for FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students), and served as vice president of a Catholic seminary.

The Catholic Foundation serves donors and furthers the Church's spiritual, educational, and charitable mission by helping people to achieve their financial and charitable planning goals within the context of the needs of our parishes, schools, and other Catholic ministries. It partners with donors in identifying and developing gift and estate planning opportunities, and utilizes endowed funds and other vehicles – such as reserve funds and capital campaigns – in support of the financial well-being of our parishes, schools, and Catholic ministries.

### **Who does The Catholic Foundation serve?**

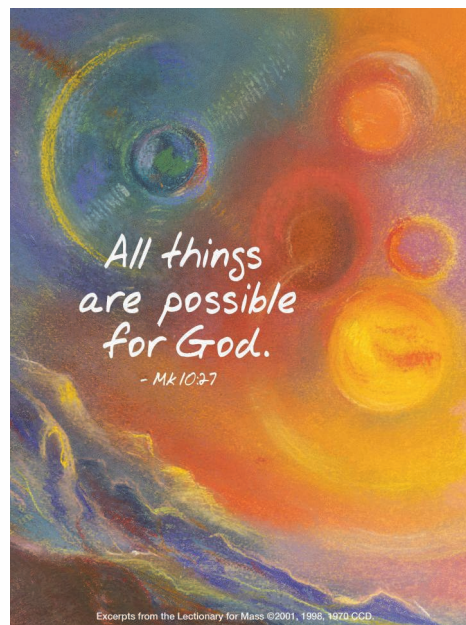
