LIVING WITHIN GOD'S TIME By Rita Zyber, RCIA and Confirmation Coordinator

"Praise him, sun and moon; praise him, all shining stars." (Psalm 148)

This past summer, I had the opportunity to make a retreat at the Weber Center in Adrian. One of the things I loved was the chance to be outside on the beautiful grounds. I could actually pay attention to the movement of the sun throughout the day.

God's grandeur was on full display at the pond, where turtles came out to soak up the sun each morning, and the frogs were busy in the afternoon. By evening, you could encounter the deer as they roamed the meadow.

Author and teacher Fr. Richard Rohr talks about a Native American custom of praying. He tells the story of families waking early to greet the rising sun. Each morning, they welcome the sun and ask it to shower blessings on all the people as it passes by.

The eternal rising and setting of the sun is something that speaks to our hearts. It reassures us that something

bigger is still at work in the world, despite the chaos and imperfection that we humans have introduced.

Last week, our staff here at St. Mary's went up to the roof to watch and celebrate the eclipse. Together, we read Psalm 148, remembering to honor the power that caused this – reminding us that it is God who has "set an order that will never change."

Thinking about the steady rhythm and perfect clockwork of God's creation reminded me that we live within God's time, in the midst of God's perfect plan for salvation and for our work as co-creators in this plan.

Together, our staff has been planning and anticipating the start of another academic year. Just as the sun rises and sets each day, so our work continues in a cycle that gives us life and joy. The golden light of summer will soon give way to shorter days and longer shadows. Still, we greet the sun, remembering the majestic hand that continues to set it in motion – giving thanks for the start of

another season and new opportunities to share this good news with all who join us at our parish.

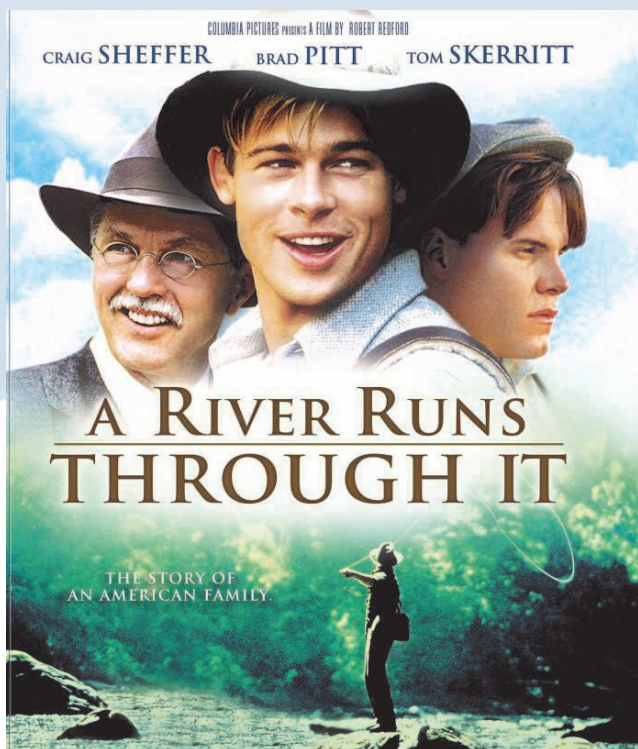
more fully enter into God's embrace.

CENTERING PRAYER

MONDAYS | 6:30 PM

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book Open Heart, Open Mind by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

BAPTISM CLASS

St. Mary Student Parish holds a baptism class, in English and Spanish, for new parents one Monday evening each month at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up materials for the discussion from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the meeting they plan to attend. The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class.

At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another. Saturday baptisms are private ceremonies usually celebrated by the deacon.

Discussion begins about 3:20pm and continues until about 4:45 or 5pm.

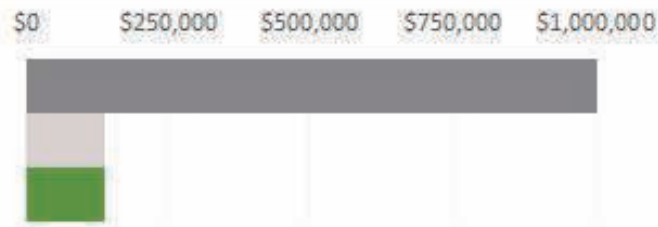

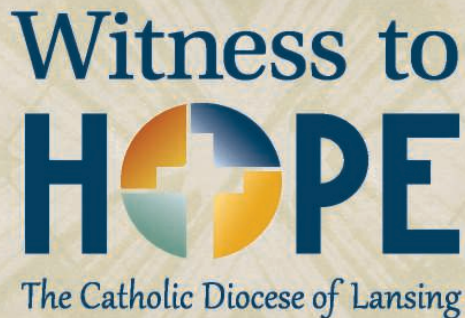
