

Welcome to St. Mary Student
Parish and to your new life at the
University of Michigan! Yes, even if
you are returning student, grad
student, young professional, or
resident parishioner, your life beginning today - is your new life.
For all of us the new year is a new
gift from God in which to learn,
grow and serve. Life moves
forward, and we must be open to
new possibility and be free to
change while continuing to be
grateful and joyful about the good
things of our past.

So as you begin this new year, it is important to claim your hopes and dreams, your space and time as fundamental to your personal well being. After all if you do not make these claims for yourself, who will make them for you!?!

We all want to make this claiming easy for you: and so we tell you with great enthusiasm that you are welcome here: you are welcome here because we welcome you and – most important – because Jesus welcomes you. We hope you will make this Roman Catholic parish your spiritual home, your home away from home, that place where you can feel safe and respected.

You belong here just as you are – with all your strengths and

weaknesses, your achievements and stumblings. Jesus welcomes you to participate in our sacramental life, notably the great prayer of the Eucharist. He welcomes you to pray with scripture together and to share faith stories, including those with less experience than you. He invites you to serve those in need, those who suffer because of institutional sin or personal sin done to them. He invites you to let go of the hurt created by the sin done to you. And he invites you to reach out in invitation to those who have chosen not to participate in their Catholic faith.

As you go through this transition to your new life, it is important to keep sight of the God-Who-Really—Is and what he is doing in your life to support and guide you. Take a few minutes each day to reflect on the following:

- 1. what blessings did you receive today? What went well, especially those "coincidental" things that made your day flow well? God is in these moments. So say thank you to God.
- 2. what particular challenges will you face tomorrow for which you need God's help? Ask God in faith.

3. in what way did you not live up to your personal best, especially to the ideals our Catholic faith offers us as our goal? Ask God to forgive you and give you the strength and wisdom to behave more wisely tomorrow.

Do this every day, and you will discover patterns of God's help and so help you grow in faith, love and desire to serve. Please join us as often as you can to be one with us, to praise God together, and help him build his kingdom.





CENTERING PRAYER

MONDAYS | 6:30 PM

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book <u>Open Heart, Open Mind</u> by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

RCIA: AN INVITATION TO EXPLORE THE CATHOLIC FAITH

If you're interested in becoming Catholic or know someone who is, we offer the opportunity for you to explore the Catholic faith in a welcoming environment. RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is designed to help people discover where God may be leading them, regardless of where they are in their own personal faith journey.

This past year, our group learned about and prepared for reception into the Catholic Church, but most importantly, they experienced an outpouring of God's love and grace for them as they prayed together, studied scripture, and explored ways to more fully enter into God's embrace.

As Pope Francis reminded us in The Joy of the Gospel, "The important thing is to not walk alone, but to rely on each other as brothers and sisters."

You might also consider RCIA if you were baptized Catholic but have not yet received the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation.

BAPTISM CLASS

9/18, 10/30, 11/27- attend one class only

St. Mary Student Parish holds a baptism class, in English and Spanish, for new parents one Monday evening each month at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up materials for the discussion from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the meeting they plan to attend. The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class.

At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another. Saturday baptisms are private ceremonies usually celebrated by the deacon.






