

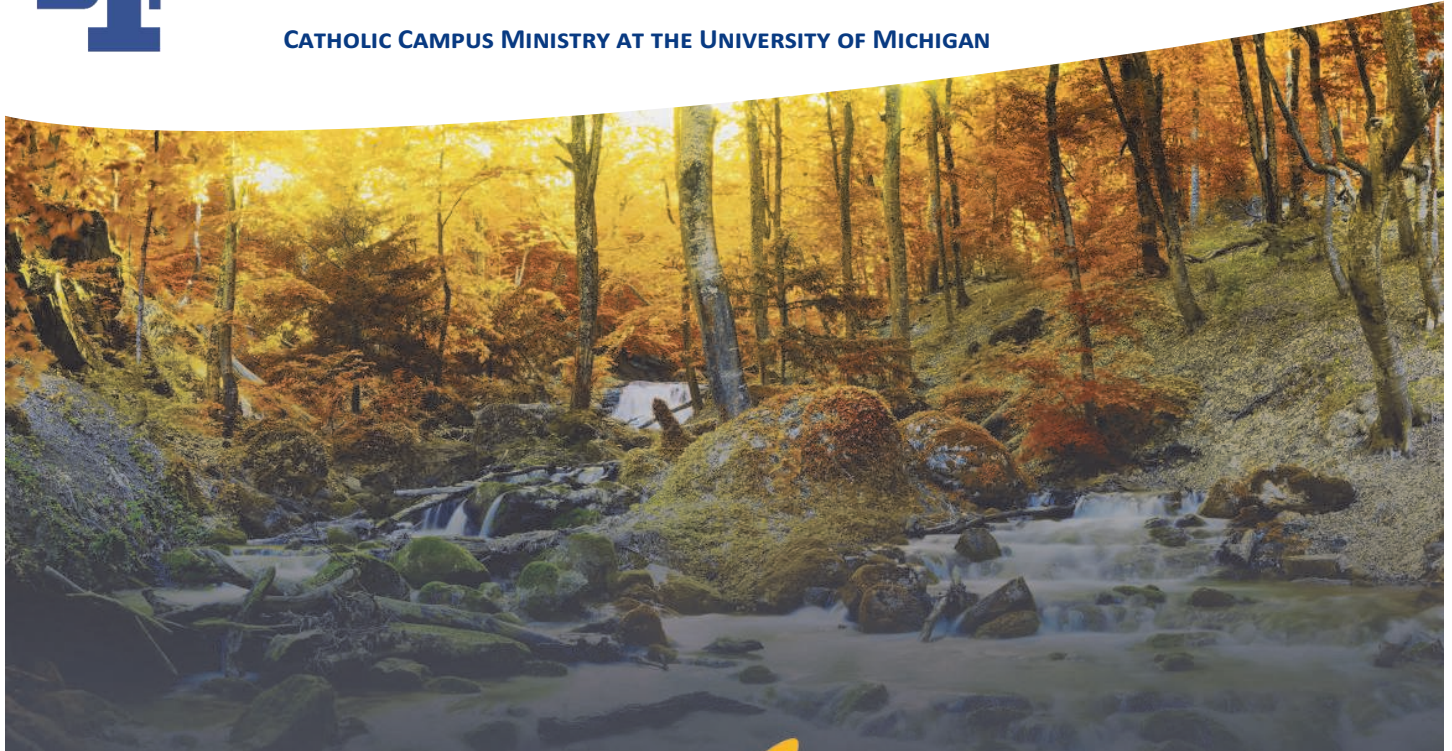

## BE A WITNESS. BE A CATECHIST.

Hello students! We hope you are feeling settled in and energized for the year. Our parish isn't the same all summer without you, so we are thrilled to have you back. We love your energy, your joy, and your passion for God.

If you're a returning student, you know we have a tradition of inviting students to partner with us as catechists. Teaching the faith to younger students is a great way to help enrich your own knowledge – and hopefully, your relationship with Christ.

We would love to have you join us in sharing God's word with our young people. It takes many students – both graduate and undergrad – to make it all work. Of course, you may be thinking – "I don't know enough about Catholicism to teach it."

A basic understanding of the faith is important, but we can help with that. Most of all, your service as a catechist is about being a witness.

"Faith formation is more than a subject to be taught – it is an invitation to a way of life. People who teach as catechists have heard and responded to God's call to form disciples of Jesus." (Joe Paprocki, *The Catechist's Toolbox*, Loyola Press)

It's about conversation with these younger students. It's about showing them that it's okay to be strong in your faith and still be able to balance friends and regular campus life. Remember when you were younger and trying to figure out how to be cool, but also active at church?

They want to hear how you managed it. They want to see that someone closer to their age has a deep love of God and wants to talk about it. Here's what some of our previous catechists have said about this ministry:

*"You don't have to be a theologian to do this. They provide the guidance and materials, plus you get paired with another catechist."*

*"It was fulfilling to know I was serving as a role model for younger students."*

*"I loved our small group time and*

*getting to know the students."*

*"I felt like I was learning new things by working with the teens and having discussions with them."*

*"Wish I could come back next year, but I'm graduating."*

We have a variety of ways in which you can help – from kindergarten classes through teen Confirmation, as well as preparation with the Hispanic/Latino community.

Keep an open mind and heart as you think about this possibility. Remember, your story could have a positive impact on a young person in ways you might never imagine. If you'd like more info, stop by and talk it over with us. We'd love to meet you.

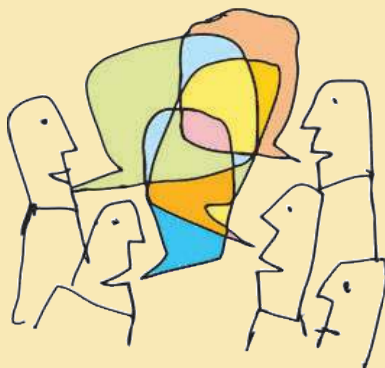

## RCIA: AN INVITATION TO EXPLORE THE CATHOLIC FAITH

If you're interested in becoming Catholic or know someone who is, we offer the opportunity for you to explore the Catholic faith in a welcoming environment. RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is designed to help people discover where God may be leading them, regardless of where they are in their own personal faith journey.

This past year, our group learned about and prepared for reception into the Catholic Church, but most importantly, they experienced an outpouring of God's love and grace for them as they prayed together, studied scripture, and explored ways to more fully enter into God's embrace.

*As Pope Francis reminded us in The Joy of the Gospel, "The important thing is to not walk alone, but to rely on each other as brothers and sisters."*

You might also consider RCIA if you were baptized Catholic but have not yet received the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation.

## CENTERING PRAYER

MONDAYS | 6:30 PM

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book Open Heart, Open Mind by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

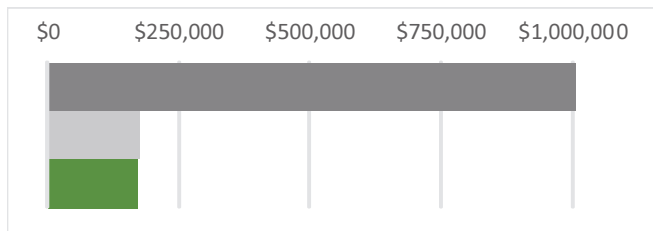
