

Pastoral Perspective

FREE TO LOVE

Let us begin with something that is familiar to each of us, the Our Father. When it comes to the phrase, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us," what is your typical reaction? Does it cut to the heart, scare you, or maybe, like me, do you often just say the words? In this prayer, we are asking Our Father to forgive us *as* we forgive others.

But how well do we forgive others? Most of us struggle with forgiving others easily. We tend to hold onto the sins of others and the ways they have hurt us, rather than react out of love and mercy. Most often, we believe the best way is to make the other pay for the hurt they have caused us. Christ offers us a different way.

When asked how many times one should forgive another, Christ stated 77 times. Essentially what this equates to is, every time. Easy? No. Freeing? Yes. As we forgive another, we are letting go of the chains we hold them by and as a result free ourselves from the anger, resentment, frustration and pride that held us bound. As we forgive, so are we forgiven.

As I reflect on being in relationship with others, it requires and even demands frequent forgiveness. However, I will be the first to admit how terrible I am at forgiving! But, as any married couple knows, forgiveness is a daily, if not multiple day, occurrence. This certainly is not easy! And the more we engage in meaningful relationships and friendships, the more we will notice the need to forgive. Forgiveness requires immense compassion, understanding, empathy and love.

Last year, I lived in a beautiful farm house on the west side of Ann Arbor. Every morning, I would make my tea and breakfast and gaze out on the beautiful pond that resided on the back of our property. Life was peaceful; roommates were a joy; life was good. However, this summer we had to move from our beloved home into a new place south of Ann Arbor. Anyone who knows me, knows how much I hate moving.

My parents traveled all the way from northern Wisconsin to help my roommates and I move into our new home. During the duration of the move, I treated them very poorly. I was motivated by stress, anxiety, and fear which resulted in irritability, rudeness, anger, frustration, and crankiness. Yet my parents simply held their tongue and worked on. I was too focused on the stress of moving that I failed to treat them with love and gratitude.

By Sunday, all the moving and unpacking had ceased and we gathered together for Mass before their departure. I sat in the pew feeling deeply remorseful for the ways I treated them, yet profoundly moved by how they unfailingly treated me with unconditional love, understanding, and mercy. Their love, not retaliation, is what changed my heart. Tears began swelling in my eyes. I felt unworthy to be at Mass because I

knew how clearly I had sinned against them and God. However, the Holy Spirit reminded me as I sat there, that that is exactly why I needed to be at Mass. Jesus died because we are sinners. We go to Mass because we are sinners and need a Savior.

God readily bestows forgiveness whenever we genuinely ask for it. So therefore, in reflection of how much we need a Savior, how can we consciously and willingly choose to withhold forgiveness from another?

I personally invite each of us to take some time for ourselves this fall and consider signing up for a Small Church Community or the Busy Person Retreat (see the opposite page for details). Use this opportunity to invite the Holy Spirit into your life and to reconnect with God's abundant love and forgiveness.






A message from the Jesuit Conference:

On September 5, 2017, the Trump Administration announced its decision to rescind the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. DACA has benefitted an estimated 780,000 individuals who came to the U.S. as children and have known this country as their home, yet lack legal status.

The Dream Act of 2017, introduced in both the Senate and the House of Representatives, is a bipartisan effort intended to protect immigrant youth who entered the U.S. as children and know America as their only home. The bill offers qualifying immigrant youth "conditional permanent resident status" and a path to eventual citizenship.

Throughout the Jesuit network, there is a great tradition of supporting young immigrants seeking to earn an education and contribute to our communities. Lift up the call of the U.S. Catholic Bishops by urging your Senators and Representative to co-sponsor the Dream Act of 2017.






