

This year's ASB Student Coordinators are John Neri and Ceci Bala, both of whom are seniors and have participated in ASB the past three years.

John: "Alternative Spring Break has been a source of growth and nourishment throughout my college career. Just as I have evolved as a college student, so too has my experience

in St. Mary's ASB. As a freshman, I traveled to Logan, West Virginia and found much needed community during a year of adjustment to college life and independence. My second ASB experience was in Chicago where I gained awareness of urban issues that expanded my perspective. As a junior,

I was a site-leader in Baltimore which afforded me the opportunity to not only serve at different organizations in the city, but also to facilitate a positive trip experience for my peers. I am privileged enough to serve ASB as a co -coordinator and continue the excellence of this program that has affected so many. Whatever point you are at in your college career, ASB can be a valuable retreat. For those considering going on a trip, I encourage you to take the leap. If anything, ASB is a solid week's time to simply restore the life balance that often becomes lopsided due to academic and extra-curricular commitments. But more importantly, ASB will be a fantastic way to develop

various aspects of faith. It will allow you to develop a community with your fellow trip

participants. It will challenge you to tackle the tough questions of faith throughout a week of reflection and discussion. It will push you to go out of your comfort zone and, like Jesus, be in communion with the neglected of our society."

Ceci: "My freshman year of college was incredibly overwhelming. Going from a small catholic high school, to a huge public university was a culture shock. But one of the things that helped make that transition easier for me was the St. Mary alternative spring break program. I was called to serve in Flint, & I have the most incredible experience living in community with my fellow ASB'ers, serving the people of Flint & learning more about myself & my catholic identity. Over my three trips (Flint, Meridian, & Cranks Creek) I have found that the definition of Catholic involves actively serving the community around me, & moving out of my comfort zone to connect with those on the margins. If you are considering ASB, I highly encourage it. I've met some of my closest friends on these trips, encountered Christ in ways I never thought possible, & truly found my calling as an educator & leader. There are numerous things to gain from this experience, the first being acceptance & love in Christ's ever growing family."


A message from the Jesuit Conference:

On September 5, 2017, the Trump Administration announced its decision to rescind the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. DACA has benefitted an estimated 780,000 individuals who came to the U.S. as children and have known this country as their home, yet lack legal status.

The Dream Act of 2017, introduced in both the Senate and the House of Representatives, is a bipartisan effort intended to protect immigrant youth who entered the U.S. as children and know America as their only home. The bill offers qualifying immigrant youth "conditional permanent resident status" and a path to eventual citizenship.

Throughout the Jesuit network, there is a great tradition of supporting young immigrants seeking to earn an education and contribute to our communities. Lift up the call of the U.S. Catholic Bishops by urging your Senators and Representative to co-sponsor the Dream Act of 2017.

Parishes are where we meet the Lord in sacrament and community. It is at our parishes that we can best live our faith, call others to Christ, and help to build up the kingdom of God. For this reason, 35% of all funds raised up to the parish goal, 65% up to 1.2x the parish goal, and and 100% of every dollar over 1.2x the parish goal raised by the parish will fund the parish's own mission and capital priorities. These funds will help parishes build new facilities for ministry, maintain current facilities, pay off debt, build parish endowments, or support other local needs. Parishes with significant projects can opt for a larger goal to meet those needs. The results of Witness to Hope will be stronger parishes, better able to advance the sacred mission of the Church.
