WITNESS TO HOPE by Fr. Ben

Generosity is one of the greatest of the spiritual virtues: generosity of outlook, of kindness, of understanding, of forgiveness (aka mercy), of friendship, of time, and of personal wealth. Your generosity and that of our spiritual ancestors back to our founding in 1924 have made this parish extraordinary in its ministry to our own parishioners and to those beyond our walls. So, I thank you for your many contributions to this parish – and to me personally.

The call to generosity can include the call to give where one might be reluctant, hesitant or even grudging. A number of you have shared with me your concerns about giving to diocesan causes outside our parish. And you have been honest with me about those hesitations. While I understand and appreciate your concerns, I am nonetheless asking you to consider a possible contribution to the diocesan Witness to Hope Campaign as an act of faith – and generosity – to the People of God throughout the diocese who believe with the same fervor as we do and serve with as great zeal.

This campaign supports the traditional works of the diocese:

- a. Catholic education for elementary and high school students, perhaps like your own children;
- b. seminary education

for young men like Vince Richardson, now Fr. Vince, who worked with us several years ago as a deacon for a year before being ordained a priest;

c. retired priests' pensions for men like Fr Charlie Irvin and (some day) Fr Tom Firestone; and

d. support to individual parishes, including our own.

We will receive one-third of all funds raised to be used for our own needs. If we can raise the full amount, we plan to use about \$235,000 toward the \$500,000 necessary to replace our history but old and fragile slate roof with one of the same appearance but of a more durable and more easily maintained material. The remaining \$100,000 will support our campus ministry programs.

To date we have received about \$225,000 in cash donations and pledges, about 25% of our goal amount. If you have already made the decision to contribute, thank you so much! If you have not, I encourage you to continue to reflect on the good this campaign can do for faithful Catholics beyond our walls. The Holy Spirit of consolation, truth and peace moves through our good intentions and good actions to bring about a fruitfulness and productivity that we cannot generate ourselves,

no matter how worthy or unworthy the human instruments. *“See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!”* (1 John 3:1).

As God as loved us, let us love those in the world around us, especially those in parishes not nearly so affluent as our own and those desiring a Catholic education yet with only limited financial resources.

We can make a difference in this world, and everything we do God magnifies for his glory and for the church's greater good.



ALPHA HOUSE

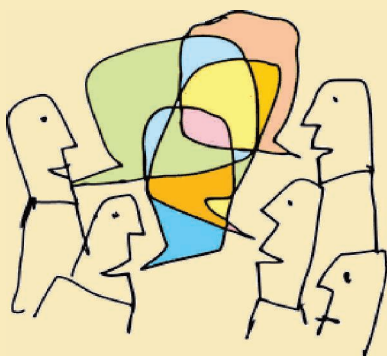

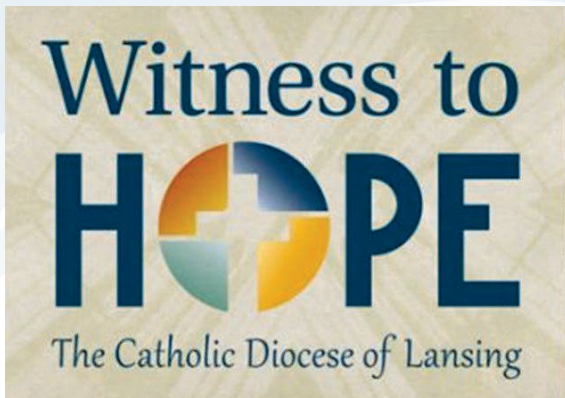

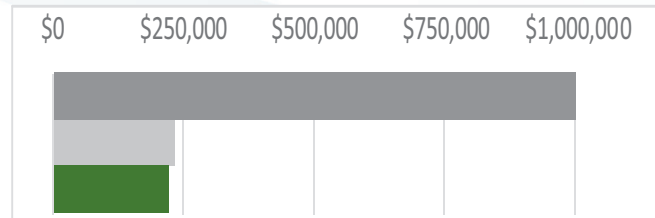
Making a Catholic education available to those families who cannot afford one is a priority of the Diocese of Lansing. These endowed funds will be used to provide need-based financial aid to students attending Catholic schools from grades K -12. This endowment will augment the funds from the current school assessment and provide substantially more resources to assist families who desire the blessing of a Catholic education. Funds will be provided on a need basis and will be capped at \$1,000 per child until the growth of the endowment allows for the cap to be raised.

CENTERING PRAYER

MONDAYS | 6:30 PM

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God.

Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book Open Heart, Open Mind by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

BAPTISM CLASS

10/30, 11/27, 12/11- attend one class only

St. Mary Student Parish holds a baptism class, in English and Spanish, for new parents one Monday evening each month at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up materials for the discussion from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the meeting they plan to attend. The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class.

At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another. Saturday baptisms are private ceremonies usually celebrated by the deacon.
