THE ONE TRUE VOICE: reflection on fall undergrad retreat



Voices. Our life is filled with countless voices, which are constantly trying to pull us in a thousand different

directions. These voices could be coming from family members, friends, school, work, society, media, or any other aspect of life. These voices are telling us to say something, do something, or be someone in order to fit a certain narrative in our lives. School, for example, is telling us to study hard and be good students. This is certainly a noble pursuit, but what would happened if we only listened to the voice of school and neglected the other areas of our life? All these external voices, when listened to in excess, can be a distraction from our true purpose.

For example, many of my engineering classmates and I attended the Career Fair which took place a few weeks ago. I spent the entire preceding week going to networking events, polishing my resume, and applying to jobs online. I was at the Career Fair all day for each of the two days it was open, neglecting classes, time to talk with family, and even prayer life. As a result, in the days following the Career Fair, I felt confused, lost, disorganized, and unfulfilled. I had been focusing so much on listening to the people who were telling me the importance of securing a good internship that I had neglected to listen to the one true Voice that will always unconditionally love and take care of us, the Voice of God.

If God's Voice is the central force that is leading and guiding our lives, we will be fulfilled as we take part in a plan that is larger than ourselves. Our actions from listening to the Lord's Voice will carry over into all areas of our life. In order for this to occur, we must continually evaluate ourselves to make sure other voices are not ruling our lives. By having God at our center, which involves taking time to listen to His Voice, we are able to keep these other voices in check and discern which voices God is calling us to be attentive and obedient to. It is essential to take the time to listen to the Lord, so that if He calls us to go out and work in the vineyard as in the Gospel, we hear His Voice above all others and can then go out and

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book <u>Open Heart, Open Mind</u> by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.


