SUPPORT OUR DREAMERS by Maria Ibarra-Frayre

Today's readings might be the perfect example of how dangerous it can be to have a narrow understanding of the Gospel, "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." When it comes to immigration some people might be quick to say, that I - as an undocumented immigrant - should have given to Cesar (our government/immigration) what belonged to Cesar. I should have "waited in line", I should have done it the right way, or my personal favorite - I should have just applied to be a U.S. citizen.

I have lived in the United States since I was 9 years, and after 18 years I still do not have a path to citizenship. I don't even have an application process, it doesn't exist. For millions of undocumented people like myself, there isn't a "Cesar" to pay. There is literally no way for me to apply to fix my status. There was a brief ray of hope in 2012 when President Obama announced an immigration relief program for undocumented youth who came to the U.S. as children - Deferred Action for Child Arrivals or DACA.

DACA wasn't extravagant, it only provided the bare necessities: a social security number, an ID/ driver's license, and the ability to

live and work legally in the U.S. without fearing deportation. DACA also wasn't permanent and on September 5, Trump revoked DACA and gave Congress six months to come up with a solution. Over a month has gone by without any progress.

So what do we do when our "Cesar" is flawed? When it is actively hurting people? What do we do when our government deports the most vulnerable to countries devastated by violence and poverty? Luckily, the Second reading offers some insight, "For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction." Power is not a word that comes to mind when thinking about our faith. except perhaps when thinking of God as all-powerful. So then, if God is all powerful, and we ourselves are made in the image of God, we must also be powerful. This power is coming to us from the Gospel in order to help us act

It is right and just to protect people, to offer them shelter and sanctuary when they are hurt. It is right and just to help a mom whose husband was just deported,

do what we know is right and just.

with conviction and strength to

or the unaccompanied minor who crossed the border escaping gang violence. And it is right and just to have a critical lens of our broken immigration system and to speak out against a government that oppresses and harms the most vulnerable. Just as God has chosen Israel as it's chosen people, we too must feel chosen to do what is right, to step up and protect our immigrant neighbors, even when it is inconvenient, even when it involves resistance and sacrifice.







CENTERING PRAYER

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book <u>Open Heart, Open Mind</u> by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.


