

Pastoral Perspective

THE FIERCE URGENCY OF NOW by Jake Derry, Campus Ministry Associate



"The Fierce Urgency of Now." This is the theme of the Martin Luther King Jr. Symposium at UofM which began on Monday

this past week. The phrase is pulled from a King speech in which he says, "...tomorrow is today. We are confronted with the fierce urgency of now. In this unfolding conundrum of life and history, there is such a thing as being too late."

The symposium's organizing group says this about the theme: "[it] calls us to claim ownership of the challenges we face and not leave them for future generations to address...compels us not only to act but also to acknowledge that the absence of action and the continuation of silence decidedly plunge us deeper into the shadows of division."

The Fierce Urgency of Now is also present in our readings this Sunday. In the second reading, St. Paul writes "the time is running out...For the world in its present form is passing away." Then, in the gospel, we hear Jesus say to Simon and Andrew and later James and John, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." The disciples didn't sit in their boats and wait a few days to think about it, they didn't ask for Jesus to perform a miracle right in front of them, or for him to explain the pros and cons of following him...they just did it, they just followed.

Why? How did they move to action so willingly? Jesus must have seriously stirred something up within them, right?

What has Jesus been stirring within you recently? How is he calling you to act?

For me, Jesus is stirring just from how much he is showing up and working through people at the Daytime Warming Center here at St. Mary. Everyday I am in awe of his presence -- from the new people I meet and the interesting stories I get to hear, the radical generosity from volunteers and guests alike, the healing grace of just playing a card game and laughing with the guys, seeing this self-governed community that's so often rejected in other parts of society striving for unity, a woman winning the job she needs to get her confidence back, a man getting the medicine his fiancé needs just in time. Not to mention the fact that two days in a row now I've had someone at the warming center tell me that they want to become a missionary.

This is just a glimpse. There's probably a hundred more ways God has shown up at the Daytime Warming Center that I've missed! I am thankful Jesus is stirring in me in this way because I know all of this that I have witnessed could so easily be missed if I wasn't paying attention, if I wasn't willing to listen, willing to be there, ready to take action like the disciples.

I want to thank everyone at the parish for your time, energy, prayers, and donations towards the Daytime Warming Center so far. We are truly grateful, but I also want to reiterate what St. Paul wrote: "time is running out," and what MLK Jr. said: "We are confronted with the fierce urgency of now."

The Daytime Warming Center at St. Mary ends on the 31st, continuing afterward at other area churches. As that ends, we have our Men's Overnight Rotating Shelter going February 5th through the 11th.

I hope from what I've shared you feel Jesus stirring within you or at least the urgency to act and contribute, in some way, to our mission of love, solidarity, and mercy.

OVERNIGHT ROTATING MEN'S SHELTER AT SMSP

FEB 5-12

Each winter, St. Mary Student Parish hosts an overnight shelter for men experiencing homelessness. This year we will host men from Monday, February 5th through Monday morning, February 12th. We are in need of a hospitality team to welcome guests and an overnight staff to spend the night.

The role of "Welcome Host" includes: some set up, welcoming guests, talking with them, and assisting as needed. The role of "Overnight Host" includes: inviting guests to begin "quiet time", taking a shift of being awake, making coffee in the morning, waking guests up, and light clean up. Two overnight hosts must be awake at any given time during the night, so if there are four total overnight hosts, you can take shifts on who is awake and who can sleep (in separate space from the guests).

EMERGENCY INTERFAITH DELEGATION TO HONDURAS

"Peace is the fruit of Justice" (Isaiah 32:17)

On January 24th, an interfaith delegation will travel to Honduras for one week to accompany threatened Jesuit priest, Revered Ismael Moreno (popularly known as "Padre Melo"), and stand in solidarity with the people of Honduras. Following fraudulent elections in December, the Honduran people have been pouring into the streets to demand their civil rights and recognition of their votes. These human rights defenders have been met with repression by Honduran security forces. Over 30 people have been killed, and hundreds more have been wounded and detained.

Padre Melo is the director of two Jesuit Human rights ministries in a Honduras: Radio Progreso, and The Reflection, Investigation and Communication Team (ERIC), a Jesuit social action center. Padre Melo spoke at St. Mary in 2015, and regularly travels to the US to meet with communities of faith and government leaders to raise awareness about human rights violations in Honduras and demand that the US government stop sending military aid. Last month, Radio Progreso's towers were destroyed, and its office vandalized. In early January, flyers started circulating on social media accusing Padre Melo and eight other social justice leaders of inciting violence and involvement in narcotics trafficking.

Although the Organization of American States asserted that the December elections did not meet standards, the US government recognized the results. Additionally, the US government continues to send funding for military and security forces in Honduras. Since the 2009 coup d'tat, the US has sent over \$100 million to the Honduran military.

Mary Anne Perrone, a St. Mary's parishioner, is one of forty people traveling as part of this interfaith delegation. Padre Melo has asked this group to "come to accompany us, to witness what is happening here and to share it with the world." Please send Mary Anne, the interfaith delegation, and the human rights defenders of Honduras your fervent prayers for strength and fortitude in their fight for justice.

When Mary Anne returns, she will share her experience with the Ann Arbor community at St. Mary. We hope you can be part of this event so that you can stand in solidarity with Padre Melo and the Honduran people by listening to their story, then continue to share the word. Look for an announcement in the bulletin when this date has been set.




PRAY THE ROSARY
