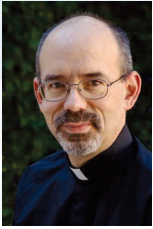

LOVING ON THE MARGINS by Fr. Joseph F. Wagner, S.J.



There is something about Fr. Greg Boyle, SJ, and his life and work with gang members in Los Angeles that touches something deep within me.

Although I had the opportunity to meet him once in Los Angeles, I can't say I know him, and he has no reason to remember me. He is a brother Jesuit, and I'm proud of that—proud to be associated with someone who does what he does. But what exactly does he *do*?

Well, of course, he is the founder of Homeboy Industries, the largest gang intervention, rehabilitation, and re-entry program in the world. Their programs offer previously incarcerated men and women everything from job training to tattoo removal to anger management and parenting classes. The institution that Greg has built from scratch is mighty impressive, and the testimony of those who have passed through it is even more so. And yet, that description doesn't really capture what Greg *does* or why I find him and his work so compelling.

To know truly what Greg Boyle does, you have to listen to him. You might do that by reading his

first book, *Tattoos on the Heart*, or perhaps his newly released *Barking to the Choir*. You might look up some of his radio interviews or track down one of his op-eds in any of the country's major newspapers. Or you might choose to listen to him in person when he speaks on campus in the Rogel Ballroom in the Union next Monday, February 5th, at 7:00pm.

However you might choose to listen to him, if you do, I think you will learn that the best way to articulate what Greg *does* is that *he loves*. His person and his stories are enveloped with an accepting, unconditional love. His is the kind of love that doesn't have an agenda, and that, of course, is the only kind of love there is, for anything else is not really love.

It might seem odd to say that his love does not have an agenda, for surely his agenda is to help those who suffer the consequences of poverty, hopelessness, and fear that often lead to gang membership. And yet, letting go of our agendas is exactly the challenge that faces anyone who is called to work with those most left out, most marginalized in our society. All of our desires to "help" or to "fix" or to "teach" or to

"correct" are in vain if we try to attach them to our love. Genuine love has no motivation, no end, no goal except to affirm the goodness of the beloved. Helping, fixing, teaching, correcting—all of those things might come later, but only at the invitation of those who first know the joy and safety of being accepted and held in unconditional love.

Greg Boyle says it this way:

"I discovered that you do not go to the margins to rescue anyone. But if we go there, everyone finds rescue."

OVERNIGHT ROTATING MEN'S SHELTER AT SMSP FEB 5-12

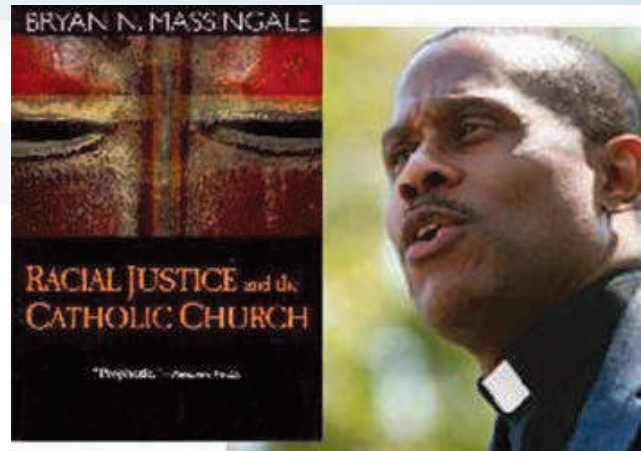
Each winter, St. Mary Student Parish hosts an overnight shelter for men experiencing homelessness. This year we will host men from Monday, February 5th through Monday morning, February 12th. We are in need of a hospitality team to welcome guests and an overnight staff to spend the night.

The role of "Welcome Host" includes: some set up, welcoming guests, talking with them, and assisting as needed. The role of "Overnight Host" includes: inviting guests to begin "quiet time", taking a shift of being awake, making coffee in the morning, waking guests up, and light clean up. Two overnight hosts must be awake at any given time during the night, so if there are four total overnight hosts, you can take shifts on who is awake and who can sleep (in separate space from the guests). 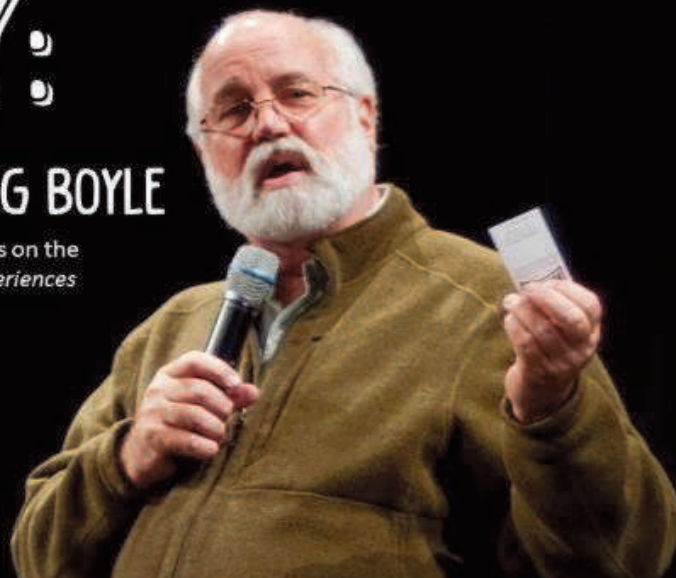
