

Since then, I've experienced so much positive change in my life. I started getting involved with the Church; I am now an intern, Eucharistic minister, catechist, and site-leader for this year's Immokalee trip. I became proud of my faith and wanted to live it in my everyday life. I wanted to build a relationship with God. And I am very confident that none of these changes in my life would have happened if I hadn't had the experience I had on ASB last year.

These ASB trips are impossible without the gifts of our resident parishioners. Because of your generosity last year, I was able to go on a wonderfully life changing experience. And with spring break quickly approaching again this year, we ask for your generosity again so that we can continue having these life changing experiences. Two overnight hosts must be awake at any given time during the night, so if there are four total overnight hosts, you can take shifts on who is awake and who can sleep (in separate space from the guests). Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

EXAMEN-OPEN SESSIONS

Invitation to a Spiritual Reflection on Experience in this Parish

Fr. Brian Paulson, S.J., Provincial of the Midwest Province of the Society of Jesus, in partnership with the other US Provincials, has asked all Midwest Jesuit parishes to initiate an Examen-type process to identify their growth and the Jesuit/Ignatian character of the parishes to include three components:

- 1. An honest, thorough self-assessment of the parish's growth in its Jesuit/Ignatian character;
- A reflection on that assessment, leading to a discernment/decision process to encourage the growth in the parish's Jesuit/Ignatian character; and
- 3. A statement of the parish's specific commitments and action steps to grow in its Jesuit/ Ignatian character and how the province may be of help in those actions.

Each session will last about one hour and will start with reflection on a scripture passage with questions to guide the reflection and move to sharing of these reflections with the group.
