

Pastoral Perspective

ASH WEDNESDAY & VALENTINE'S DAY... by Fr. Pat Casey, Pastoral Associate





This year for the first time since 1945 the celebration of Ash Wednesday and Valentine's day fall on the same day.

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the penitential season of Lent and, appropriately enough, it is a day of fasting, abstinence, and prayer. Catholics 18-59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Catholics 14 and older are also required to abstain from meat on those days, and on Lenten Fridays. According to the US Bishops' Conference, a person fasting "is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal."

Valentine's Day remembers a thirdcentury Christian martyr, who died defending marriage, and has become a celebration of romantic love, replete with candies, special

menus, flowers, and everything nice for a special person.

When we realize that Lent is a time of preparation to remember all that Jesus, the Son of God, did for us, restoring our relationship with God and opening the gates of heaven by dying on the cross, it seems hard to imagine that a day, which has been created by merchants more than lovers, should be considered more important. And so, it seems natural that those who under-stand the importance of our Catholic Faith would consider the obligation of fast and abstinence a priority.

There has been a long tradition in many counties and cultures to prepare for Lent with parties, parades, and, sometimes crazy carrying on. It is called Mardi Gras. Mardi Gras, also called Shrove Tuesday, or Fat Tuesday, in English, refers to events of the Carnival celebrations, beginning on or after the Christian feasts of the Epiphany (Three Kings Day) and culminating on the day before Ash Wednesday. Some American Bishops have suggested that Catholics planning to celebrate Valentine's Day could do so on Feb. 13th, which, this year, is Mardi Gras.

The ashes used on Ash Wednesday come from the burnt palm branches or branches of other trees, which

were blessed the previous year on Palm Sunday. They call to mind the way penance was practiced in ancient times. Remember the tale of Nineveh when they wanted to express their repentance. The people dressed in sack cloth and put ashes on their heads. Ashes also remind us that all the success and riches that we accumulate in this mortal life will mean little when we come to the end of our days. What will matter is how much we have fulfilled the will of God living as images of Jesus the Christ.

Lent is a time for reflection and examination of our consciences and a time to put in order our lives, trying to eliminate the bad and augment the good that we do. With ashes we are symbolically saying, "Lord I am a creature who needs you. Forgive me my failings and allow me to continue on my journey home to the Father."
