

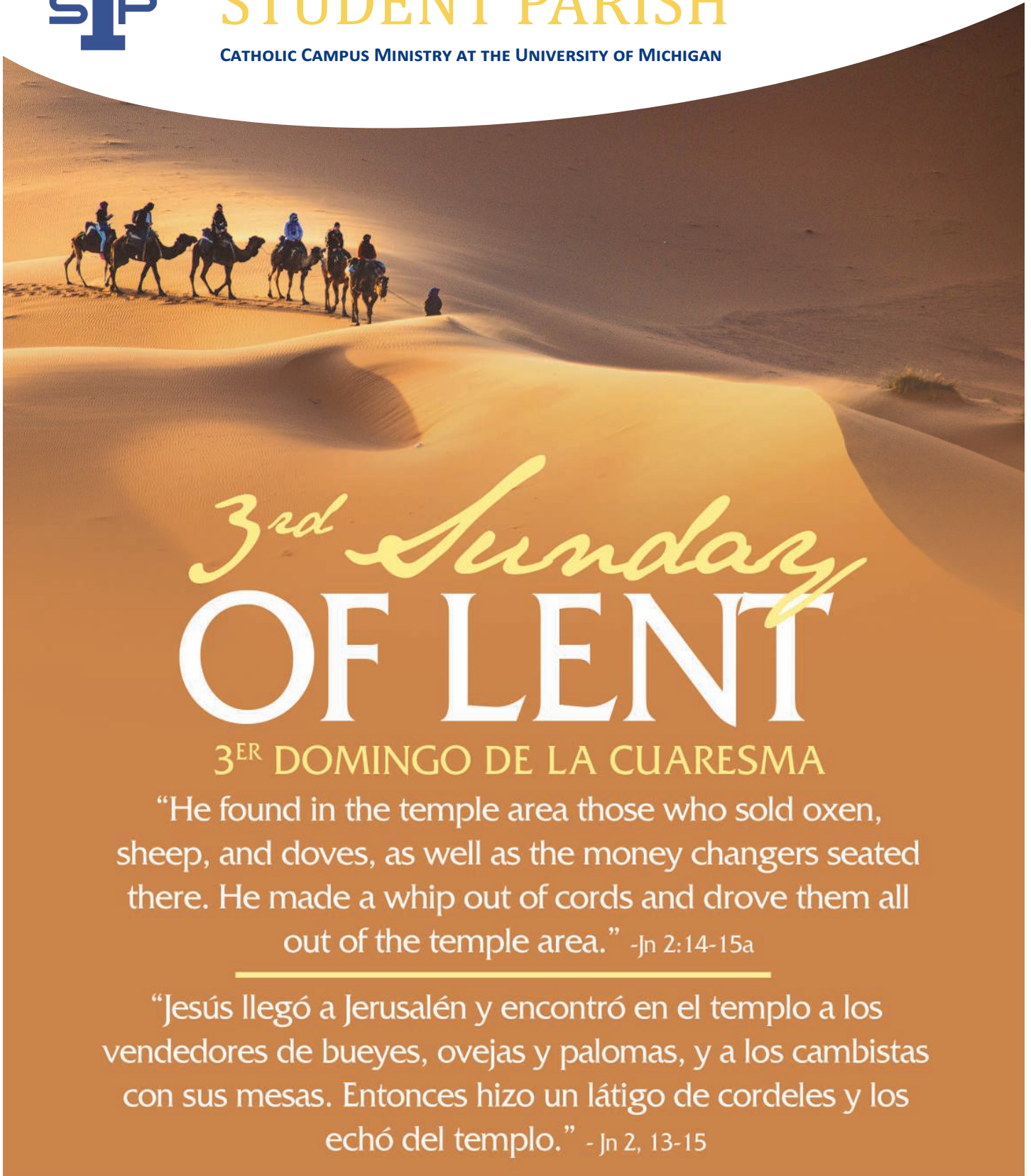

WATER SUSTAINS US by Danielle Kopin, Stewardship Director



Water sustains us. We rely on it to quench and cleanse us. We use water to grow our food and to baptize

our brothers and sisters. A life-giving necessity, water is referenced repeatedly in this week's scripture. In the desert, a desperate Moses called on God to help him appease the Israelites, who had become skeptical and very thirsty. In the gospel reading, we find our salvation in Jesus' living water.

"The water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Jesus revealed Himself and offered to give freely His living water, if she asked, to an unfamiliar Samaritan woman whose sins He knew. I am reminded by this that He has a perfect love for us all, despite our sins, betrayals, and imperfections. He suffered and died for all that we carry within us. He offers us His living water and invites us to open our hearts, to accept His sacrifice, and to rejoice in His love which bears our salvation.

In a way, I admire the Samaritan woman. I imagine her being so awe-

struck by her encounter with Jesus that she runs back to town, forgetting her belongings. And in the center of town, in front of everyone—who probably already knew the woman's shameful reputation—she claims that Jesus is the Messiah and is willing to admit and even emphasize her sinful lifestyle to convince the others. "He told me everything I ever did." Of course, I don't admire her for her sins, but her humility in that moment.

Would I have done the same? I'd like to think that as she sat with Jesus, the woman felt forgiveness. Indeed, I would be left feeling light and free—excited to share the greatness of Christ's love and our salvation.

The spring of water to eternal life is a powerful image in my reflection. The spring that is inside of me, at times, feels like it gushes, it bubbles vigorously in praise and overflows with Christ's love. In these times, it's easy to walk with Christ. I recognize all that I am blessed with and want to give freely the joy of His love.

There are also difficult times when I'm struggling and can feel barely a trickle of His living water in me. In these times, like Moses, I am called to trust that God provides all I that I need.

I pray that, even when I feel that my spring is barely a trickle, I am able to embody the love of Jesus and give it freely to others—those who have hurt me, those who look, speak, or worship in a different way than I do, and those who are forgotten and have never experienced love of any kind. I ask Jesus to take all that I carry and open my heart. He knows my sins and I am forgiven.

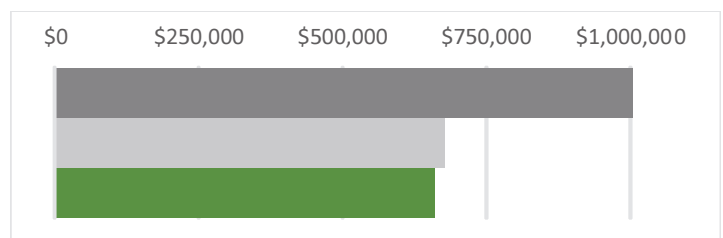

Year-to-Date Offering Report as of 02/25/2018

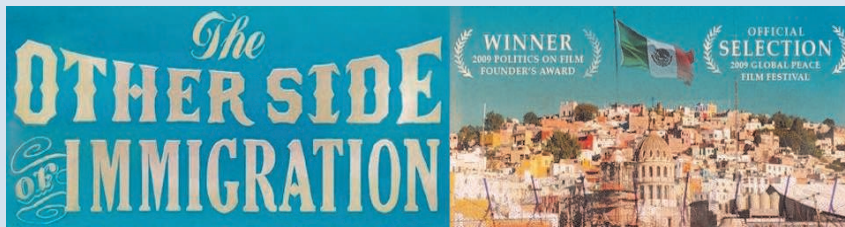

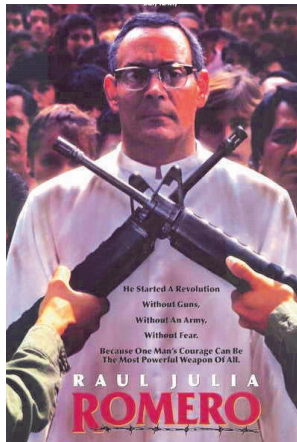


ICPJ LATIN AMERICAN TASK FORCE DINNER & A MOVIE NIGHT

CENTERING PRAYER

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God.

Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book "Open Heart, Open Mind" by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.
