## BREAKING THE SILENCE: HEALING THE RACIAL DIVIDE

Today's Liturgy celebrates what life was like after the Resurrection of Jesus.

The Gospel tells

us that for at least 2 weeks the disciples were hiding in a room somewhere in Jerusalem, because fearing, that if they were caught, the same fate that befell Jesus would be theirs...after all they could neither hide their accents as Galileans nor their grief. Twice during those 2 weeks Jesus shows up and offers them a gift: PEACE. In the midst of their betrayals, fear, disillusionment, discouragement, despair, loss and disappointments, Jesus comes to offer them PEACE. Implied in that PEACE is forgiveness for the betrayal, under-standing of their disappointment and a compassion for their feelings of discouragement and abandonment.

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles is a fast forward of 60+ years from the events of the Gospel. It provides us with a snapshot of how seriously this early community took the words and the life of Jesus. Can you imagine owning nothing personally that the community did not own? If you had a home, you sold it so that others would have a place to live. No one was needy and it was up to the apostles to distribute in justice what the community members needed. This was indeed a proto-type of the

Beloved Community, a phrase that came to be centuries later.

How far removed we have become since those early days of Christianity. We now live in a country where there are more and more people made poor by our long failing economic system. We live in the midst of the vilest expressions of hatred, violence and revenge that were once subtle but are now overt on every stage of our lives. Truth and proof are called 'lies.' Facts and documentation is called 'conspiracy theory'. And being accountable is no one's responsibility.

Where do we begin to heal the wounds that are destroying our communities? Where do we reclaim the reality that we are all equal? Where do we break open the silence that has been a cover up of the racial divisions in this country?

Today's Gospel ends with this sentence: "Jesus did many other signs that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe in Jesus and have life in Jesus' name."

Next Saturday, at 9am in Donnelly Hall, we will have the opportunity to begin looking together at the signs that Jesus is doing NOW in bringing about an inclusive and dynamic community here in Ann Arbor.

How do we, as a people, begin to heal and to form the Beloved Community so wanted by the One we name as God?

There are signs of Resurrection all around us. Can we see them? Can we lend our support? Can we begin to envision a community of equals, all sharing in one life, believing in each other, having equal access to all resources and growing in beloved -ness together?

She earned a B.A. in Sociology/Social Work from Annhurst College and an M.A. in Pastoral Ministry and Counseling from Emmanuel College. After re-locating to the MD area, she was Case Management Supervisor for the Families that Work Program at My Sister's Place Women Center in Baltimore, MD.
