SETTING THE TONE by Fr. Ben Hawley, SJ



"The person in charge sets the tone." I have never seen this statement in any book of management, administration, or

leadership. But it should be in such books, and it should be in the mind and heart of parents, teachers, coaches, priests, supervisors and managers (among others), because they are the tone-setters of those entrusted to them. Our model is Jesus, who sets a tone of compassion, generosity and honesty. The Kingdom is the place where Jesus' is the only tone.

In a parish the pastor sets the tone. A change of pastors, therefore, has profound implications for the parish institution. To the extent that his tone has been aggressive, or authoritarian, then his departure will be a relief. To the extent that his tone has been forward-looking, compassionate, and faith-filled, then his departure can be a source of anxiety.

Faithful Catholics can believe that Jesus influences choices of pastors without interfering with the freewill of the Jesuit provincial and the bishop who appoint them. In our parish the selection of a long-term pastor will occur a year from now. For the moment we have two interim pastors, known officially as

parish administrators, Fr. Joe Wagner, SJ, and Fr. Jim Gartland, SJ, and we are embarking on the process of transition from me to

In this transition it will be helpful to keep certain principles in mind.

First principal: "If you have met one Jesuit, then you have met one Jesuit." This principle contrasts to the idea that "If you have met one (fill in the blank), then you have met them all." But in fairness the former principle applies to us all. Whoever the new parish administrators and eventual pastor are, they are not me. They will have their own ideas and ways of proceeding. Even if they set a similar tone, it will be their tone and not mine.

It is important therefore for us to set expectations that allow for this difference, hoping that they will also take the time for their own transition to the reality that is our parish today.

Second principle: Human life moves forward, not backward. However much one may have valued an earlier iteration of this parish or the present iteration, the parish can only continue to evolve into our future, not to try to stay in this present or return to how we may remember an earlier stage.

The transition process can be harder than it looks. One way of doing things becomes the norm, and adjusting to someone and something new can be challenging.

Our helper in this transition is of course the Good Shepherd who hears our voices and offers his comfort, strength and guidance as we move forward through the unknown of transition. We can be confident in his care of us since he has done so much for us already.

This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad.






There are so many reasons to give to the DSA. Here are a few that may resonate with you and your family:
