STOP PADDLING AND REST by Brian Cerabona, Campus Minister



One moment last summer, I went kayaking with my brother and found myself racing to explore the lake. I grew

tired quickly and I stopped in the middle of the lake. I just let the current take me and floated for about 15 minutes. Taking that moment to rest, it allowed me to experience God's presence and peace. There was a lot to sort through that summer and God truly sat with me in that kayak. Sometimes, we need to allow ourselves to sit in the current of our lives with God and just float.

In reflecting on the readings for both this weekend and next, there is one word that caught my attention: **dwelling**. Dwelling makes me think about words like abiding or resting. The last few weeks, God has been asking me to rest, which I do not do well. The transition into the summer has made me realize how I actively fight against resting. It can be difficult to give ourselves rest living in a culture that measures our worth by our productivity. In *Building a Discipling Culture* by Mike Breen,

one of the chapters talks about the importance of rest in all of our ministries, saying that "we have become human doings rather than human beings." This chapter has really challenged me to reflect on the ways in which I am learning how to rest.

Something that I have incorporated into my day has been starting work by resting in the Chapel. I say, "God, this is your day and not mine. What do you want me to do today?" Starting our days from a place of rest, we can live in greater joy out of the peace that comes from centering ourselves first on God who loves us for who we are rather than what we do.

Where do you find rest?

How is God asking you to dwell with Him this week?

We give our hearts to our work, family, friends, and many other things in this world (often times in this order). These are all good, and yet our love is finite. Our heart must first be given to God. We need the infinite, divine love that God calls us to dwell in to fuel our lives with His love. I invite you to ask God to enter that place of rest with you this week and allow Him to speak to you. Let us **dwell** in the

knowledge that we are loved infinitely more than we can ever imagine.

This summer, I am working at the Gallup livery with canoe and kayak rentals. I realize a connection from my ministry this past year and this summer job. God invites us all to provide a space of rest for others to encounter Him. Whether giving students a space to rest here at St. Mary or providing people with kayaks, we are inviting people to rest where God can meet them. Stop paddling and rest.

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God.

Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book "Open Heart, Open Mind" by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between.

⇒ **In the meantime, feel free to meet with us to personally discuss what God may be calling you to explore.**

prayer, scripture, topic presentation and discussion.

There's no pressure or obligation. You are welcome to explore and ask questions as you decide if this is right for you.

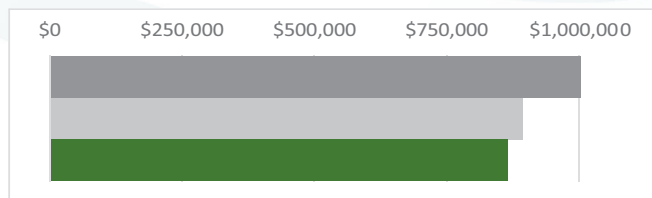

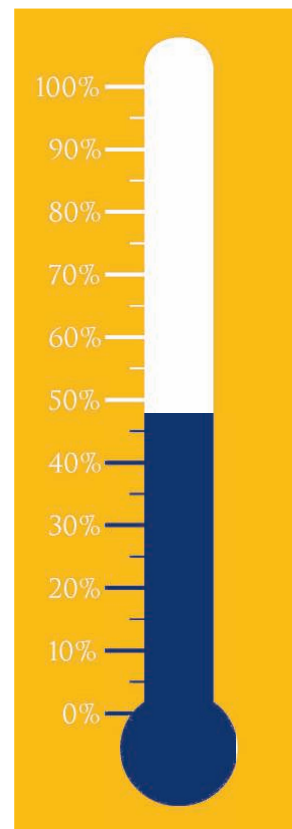
Why has the DSA returned so soon?

The DSA appeal was last conducted during the Lenten season in 2016, over 2 years ago, and funded important operations and ministries through the 2016-2017 fiscal year. A small share of contributions to the Witness to Hope campaign was designated to sustain these operations and ministries for one year only, fiscal year 2017-2018. All other Witness to Hope contributions have designated purposes and cannot be used to fund the ongoing costs of these operations and ministries. This DSA is necessary to support this mission through the next fiscal year.

We have reached 47% of our DSA goal and over 60 families have contributed to this year's appeal thus far.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed. Sharing your blessings enables dozens of ministries to help people both spiritually and physically – bringing hope, comfort, and salvation to so many in our diocese.
