## WE WERE DESIGNED BY GOD by Jenny Line, Campus Minister



How many of us struggle with comparison? I know I do. The culture we live in breeds comparison at our every turn. All around us, we are

constantly compared to others and hear and see messages that tell us we are not enough. "You need to have this degree or that credential, you need a bigger house, you need to be this size or fitness level, you need to think in this way, etc., you get the picture. The list gets exhausting! Furthermore, I cannot begin to describe how many times I meet with others and hear these words, "I am not enough."

So what do we do? We have two options: either we believe those messages and live into them or rebuke those lies and fill ourselves with what we know is true.

R. (14) I praise you, for I am wonderfully made.

O LORD, you have probed me, you know me:

you know when I sit and when I stand; you understand my thoughts from afar.

Truly you have formed my inmost being;

you knit me in my mother's womb.
I give you thanks that I am fearfully,
wonderfully made;
wonderful are your works.

My soul also you knew full well; nor was my frame unknown to you. The world may want to compare us and put us at ends with each other, but God has a different way. God created each of us as unique as each snowflake that falls from the sky. All of us are unrepeatable, beautiful and valued for exactly the way we were designed by God.

We do not have a faulty creator. There is no mistake in us. We were created by God as very good. And it gives God great joy when He sees his daughter or son living to their full potential. It gives God great comfort seeing one of His beautiful creations in love with the person He designed them to be.

May we take Irenaeus' words to heart: "The glory of God is a human being fully alive."

I think that is what strikes me most about St. John the Baptist. John knew who he was and who he was not. Some people call this true humility. When John could have easily taken fame for himself, he willingly and gratefully pointed others to the true Messiah, Jesus Christ. John the Baptist knew what his mission in life was: to make a way for the Lord. John did exactly that, nothing more and nothing less.

God has a unique calling for each of us as well. What is the mission God has made for your life?

Or maybe like the little girl on the brink of death, maybe we too need to be risen to new life in Christ. It is never too late to live the mission God destined us for.

Be encouraged by St. Catherine of Siena's words: "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire."

The world needs your mission to reach its completion. Spend some time these next couple of weeks to rediscover or discover your mission from God. God has GREATNESS in store for you. The only thing that would hold you back is you. So, will you answer His mission in your life?

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God.

Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book "Open Heart, Open Mind" by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between.


## **HISPANIC/LATINO MINISTRY**



Year-to-Date Offering Report as of 06/17/2018






## 2018 DIOCESAN SERVICES APPEAL


