DO YOU RECOGNIZE THE VOICE OF GOD?

In today's first reading from the prophet Ezekiel we hear about the

Lord speaking, the Holy Spirit enabling the people to hear the words, and a sending forth. These themes are constant in the word of God, and for good reason. Our Creator is constantly calling us, and once called, he will send us forth.

We are all called to a vocation. Whether we are married or single, ordained or consecrated, God speaks to all of us at some point in our lives and will give us the grace to live that vocation if we ask him.

Many years ago, God answered the simple prayer of a young man as he said "Lord, my life is a mess. Help me to know what I should do". That young man then went to a pay phone and proposed to me. Praise be to God Tom and I recently celebrated our 38th anniversary! While we were away celebrating we went to mass that Wednesday at the Cathedral of St. Andrew in Grand Rapids. Tom had arranged prior to our trip that the intention of the mass would be for our intentions. Just prior to the final blessing the priest asked us to approach the altar. There he asked everyone to pray for us as we reaffirmed our promise to love each other all the days of our lives. When Tom gave me a little kiss the joy in the room was palpable (even in a room of strangers)!

One way in which Tom and I ask for the grace to live out our vocation of marriage is at each Sunday mass we have a little ritual. As the altar is prepared for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, either Tom or I will take our wedding ring off and hand it to the other. For a few moments we will both pray and thank God for his presence in marriage and pray for each other. We may mention a current struggle or need, and ask for direction.

The beauty of our Catholic mass makes it possible for this little prayer to be mystically joined to the gifts of the people, and they are then carried to the altar to be transformed with the bread and wine. The wonder of our faith!

Whatever your vocation is ask the Lord for what you need. The Lord hears our prayers, he is faithful. Once we ask, be confident that your request will be answered. Perhaps you will hear something in the quiet of your heart during a prayer time, something will stand out in a scripture passage, through a priest in a homily or in confession, perhaps wise words from a good friend or family. Ask, listen and wait.

The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Philippians 4:5-6

AN UPDATE FROM THE HISPANIC/LATINO MINISTRY



Strategic separation of families. ICE raids. Detentions and deportations. In times like these it is easy to become overwhelmed by despair. I invite you to join us as we focus on the glimmers of light, the signs of hope. Over the next month, I will share several with you.

In May, I attended a **Jesuit Migration Network (JMN)** meeting in Washington, D.C., connecting individuals and institutions from around the country who work with

immigrant communities like ours here at St. Mary. **JMN** is a network of Jesuit and Jesuit-affiliated organizations focused on migration issues throughout North and Central America. Through direct service, accompaniment, research, and advocacy, **JMN** seeks to protect the human rights and dignity of migrants and their families. St. Mary's involvement with **JMN** will provide support and resources for St. Mary and, on an international level, amplify the Jesuit response to injustices faced by our immigrant brothers and sisters.

You may have noticed our new **Campaign for Hospitality** Welcome banners hanging outside along Thompson Street. St. Mary has also recently joined the Campaign for Hospitality, coordinated by the Ignatian Solidarity Network. We join a host of other Jesuit parishes, schools, and organizations who aim to focus on Encounter, Understanding, and Action in order to create a more hospitable community for our immigrant and refugee brothers and sisters. There are many ideas listed on the campaign's webpage – we welcome any ideas and volunteers interested in making an event or idea come to life!

It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book "Open Heart, Open Mind" by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between.
