WE BECOME WHAT WE RECEIVE

When I was quite young, maybe three or four years old, I was a terrible eater. I was so undersized, in fact, that doctors told my parents my height would rival those with dwarfism.

Getting me to eat anything was a family affair. We would inevitably choose pizza when dining out because one of the few items I ate were mushrooms. I would pick them off the pizza, not even eating the cheese, nor the crust. I ate so many mushrooms that I grew tired of them, swearing them off for probably 20 years. My 10-year old self remembers telling others, "Why would I want to eat fungus? That's Gross!"

At age five, I had my tonsils removed. It turns out they were swollen for so much of my early life that eating was painful. While my tastes were still quite simplistic, I began to eat. And eat. And now I'm a very normal sized human (thanks mom & dad for sticking with me).

As an adult, my palate is certainly more refined. I eat mushrooms - all kinds - and the list of dislikes is quite short: olives, coconut, and melon.

Tastes often mature with age. They are also vastly different from person to person, and region to region. Yet there is one food that satisfies hunger more deeply than any salty Italian cheese, or ripened Michigan cherries.

It's the Bread of Life.

Each week, we come together to celebrate Jesus' body and blood. Our journeys to the altar are quite different, yet we all seek the same thing: to satisfy a hunger for life, a hunger for love, even a hunger for eternity.

It is here, at the Lord's table, that we are really satisfied. With the Eucharist, the Lord himself journeys to meet us. He comes to us; we do not go to him! He does not leave us alone on this journey.

In the Eucharist, we become what we receive. We are transformed into Jesus Christ – one with him and with all who are one in his body, the Church. We cannot simply eat the Lord's body the way one eats a piece of bread. We can only receive him by welcoming him into our whole life, which means welcoming him into our hearts and our actions.

In just a few short weeks we celebrate the start of another academic year. Young people return to campus, eager to be satisfied. Their minds, eager for knowledge. And their hearts, eager for Jesus.

On Labor Day, we will host hundreds of undergraduates for our annual welcome mass followed by a BBQ in our courtyard. Many faces will be familiar, yet others will be new. We will share in their journeys, discovering where God is at work in their lives.

We invite you to sign-up to help us host this wonderful event - help us welcome these eager students into our community.

We need volunteers to help set-up, serve, and clean-up (see our sign-up list in the atrium). But most of all, help us build a longer table, not a taller fence.

AN UPDATE FROM THE HISPANIC/LATINO MINISTRY



St. Mary's Immigration Team has been working with migrant families and individuals to prepare for detainment and/or deportation by ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement). Together with MIRC (Michigan Immigrants Rights Center) and WICIR (Washtenaw Interfaith

Coalition for Immigrant Rights), St. Mary has produced a cohesive flyer, helping those at risk know how to prepare and what to do if they are arrested. This flyer was requested by the community, and we are hopeful it can serve as a quick reference in those moments of panic.

Our Immigration Team would like to thank all of you who volunteered to be on our drivers list to provide rides to our undocumented parishioners if/when a need arises. We have about 30 volunteers on the list right now, and we are always accepting more. Email me aketner@smpsnewman.org for more information and to sign up. What a sign of hope to see how many parishioners are interested in helping!

Please continue to stay in tune to what is happening nationally and locally with our immigration policies, and how they are carried out. They deeply affect the real lives of millions of our brothers and sisters, thousands of whom live in our Washtenaw County community.



Finally, I invite you to join us **TODAY** Sunday, August 5th following the 10 AM mass in Newman Hall to share some donuts, pan dulce (traditional Mexican sweet bread), and coffee, and to hear more about these updates from our Hispanic/Latino community. 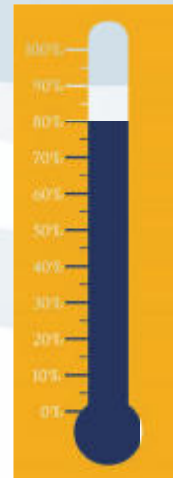

CENTERING PRAYER

MONDAYS | 6:30 PM

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God.

Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book "Open Heart, Open Mind" by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between.

FALL: In the fall semester the parish's book group will examine issues around stewardship.

Sept 11: We will start with *"Who Will Provide? The Changing Role of Religion in American Social Welfare"* by Mary Jo Bane, Brent Coffin, and Ronald Thiemann. This 2004 book appears to be available in used form from the usual sources. Oct 9: We will continue our study of stewardship by reading Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, *"Gaudete et Exsultate"* available for download here (in English): https://w2.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/apost_exhortations/documents/papa-francesco_esortazione-ap_20180319_gaudete-et-exsultate.pdf - Please come and talk about the challenges of being holy in the modern world.

Nov 13: Our semester of stewardship continues with *"The Vice of Luxury: Economic Excess in a Consumer Age"* by David Cloutier. A parishioner who has read the book describes it as "a recent book by a Catholic moral theologian, going from classical ethics, through economic history, up to recent encyclicals...[that asks] what should you do with your money?" This 2016 book will be available on reserve at Literati or may be obtained through the usual other sources.

Dec 11: We conclude our semester of studying stewardship by looking at one man's late-life understanding of himself in relation to the world. We will read Joseph Cardinal Bernardin's *"The Gift of Peace."* This may be available on reserve at Literati but is certainly available in both new and used formats through the usual sources.

WINTER: This winter the Catholic Thinkers Book Club will be looking at issues of early Church history, focusing a lot of attention on Saint Paul.

Jan 8: We will start off with Karen Armstrong's 2015 book (only 143 pages) *"Saint Paul: The Apostle We Love to Hate."* Copies of this book will be on reserve at Literati or you may obtain it through any of the other usual sources.

Feb 12: We will continue our study of early church history by taking a deep dive into the thought and ongoing influence of St. Paul in Garry Wills' 2006 book *"What Paul Meant."* Copies will be available on reserve at Literati, or you may obtain this book through your usual sources.

Mar 12: We are starting off Lent by reading Nikos Kazantzakis' novel *"The Last Temptation of Christ,"* a reinterpretation of the Gospels that fleshes out Christ's Passion. Copies will be available on reserve at Literati or may be obtained through the usual sources.

Apr 9: The Catholic Thinkers Book Club will conclude its semester about early Church history by reading Elaine Pagels' *"The Gnostic Gospels."* We will provide updates about where copies may be obtained.
