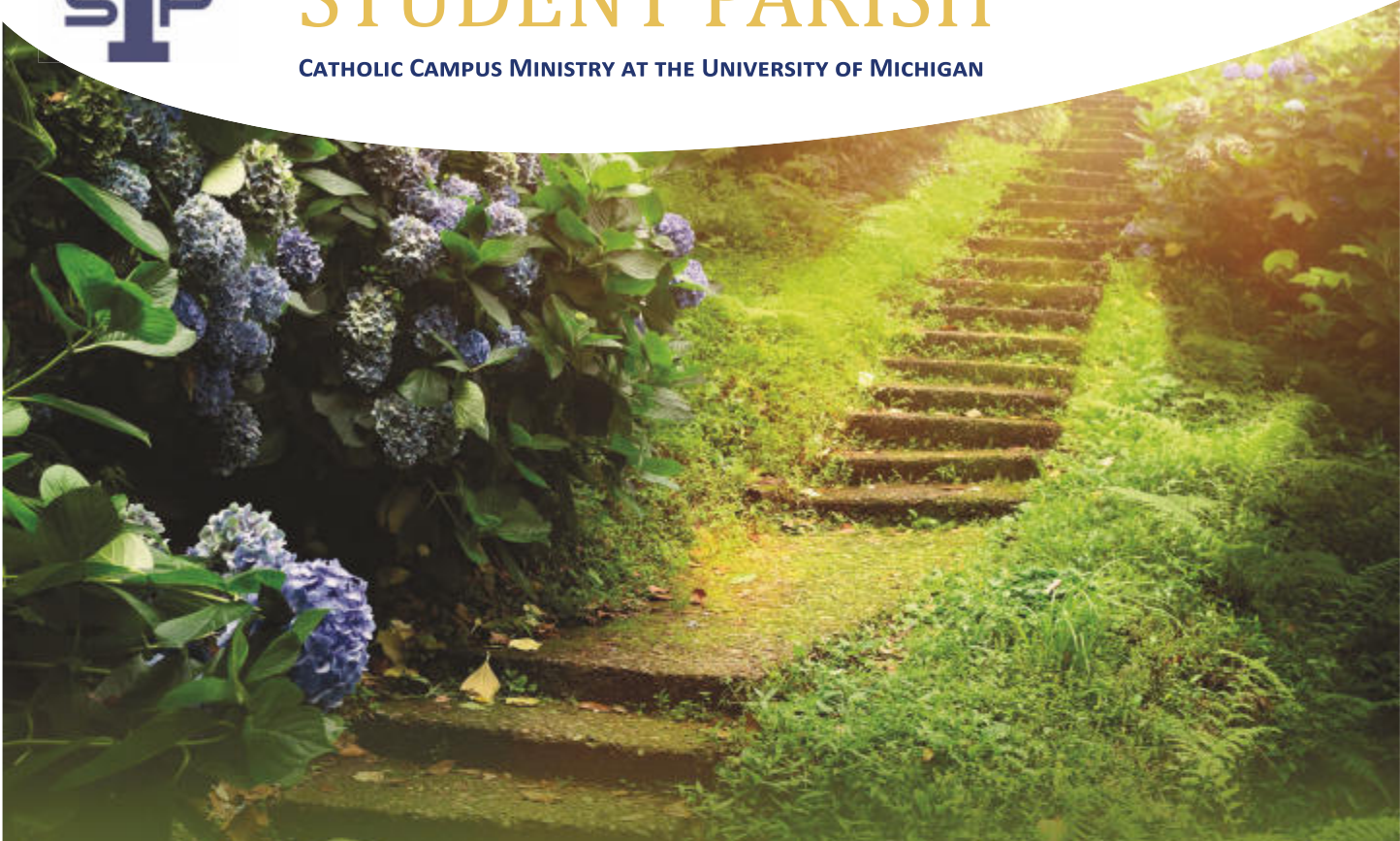

ON BEING BOTH WOUNDED AND WELCOMING

“God help us, not again.” I doubt that those were my exact thoughts, but that captures what I felt when I first heard of the Pennsylvania grand jury report

detailing 70 years of abuse across many of the Catholic dioceses of Pennsylvania.

I felt angry, I felt frustrated, I felt repulsed, as I read all-too-graphic details of pain and trauma inflicted on the lives of so many. The “not again” feeling was dominant.

Over the past 20 or more years, we as a church and society have continued to revisit these reports, each time with deeper and more significant revelations, and each time leaving me wishing, hoping, that this would be the end of it. There is a base desire within me just to have it all over with, to be done with it, to move on.

Or, at least, just to bury my head in the sand and hope it all passes.

But it doesn't work that way, of course. Nor does it work that way for the victims of sexual abuse. Their trauma, their pain, and the effects of their experiences do not simply go away. They, too, endure years of suffering, sometimes in waves, and sometimes as more significant revelations come even to them only over time.

Healing can come, but sometimes agonizingly slowly, and sometimes with the knowledge that things get worse again before they get better.

I have no first-hand experience of their pain, but I can't help but think that what we as a church are going through over what has become years of revelations, is somehow a dim reflection of their ongoing woundedness.

Our path as a church toward healing, toward justice, toward wholeness, must somehow reflect the same path of the victims we mourn.

In the midst of all this, we at St. Mary Student Parish are preparing for the beginning of a new academic year, and we are incongruously faced with all the celebrations that go along with it.

Similarly, the Diocese of Lansing is preparing for a celebratory “Made for Happiness” convocation next month.

As a parish staff, we have struggled with choosing how to respond. The answer that I think we have come to, however imperfect, is that we must not run away from or ignore the ongoing need to face honestly and head-on the failings of our church and its leadership and to call it to both moral and civil accountability, but neither can we fail to welcome with joy a new community of Catholic Christians whose attraction and commitment to the joy of the Gospel is more powerful than all the reasons

we might imagine for staying away from the church at this time.

We are the Body of Christ, and above all, we are called to be committed to one another, both in joy and in sorrow.

We have to hold even the darkest effects of sin and evil in tension with the faith we have in the ultimate power of Christ to heal and to make whole.

If our Church is to look with hope to future, then that hope will be found in the deepening faith of its youngest members today.

It will be a bittersweet time of welcome this year, but it carries within it the seeds of the future of our Church.

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God.

Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book "Open Heart, Open Mind" by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between.

CATHOLIC THINKERS BOOK CLUB

SECOND TUESDAY OF THE MONTH | 7-8:30PM-LOYOLA ROOM

FALL: In the fall semester the parish's book group will examine issues around stewardship.

Sept 11: We will start with *"Who Will Provide? The Changing Role of Religion in American Social Welfare"* by Mary Jo Bane, Brent Coffin, and Ronald Thiemann. This 2004 book appears to be available in used form from the usual sources. Oct 9: We will continue our study of stewardship by reading Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, *"Gaudete et Exsultate"* available for download here (in English): https://w2.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/apost_exhortations/documents/papa-francesco_esortazione-ap_20180319_gaudete-et-exsultate.pdf - Please come and talk about the challenges of being holy in the modern world.

Nov 13: Our semester of stewardship continues with *"The Vice of Luxury: Economic Excess in a Consumer Age"* by David Cloutier. A parishioner who has read the book describes it as "a recent book by a Catholic moral theologian, going from classical ethics, through economic history, up to recent encyclicals...[that asks] what should you do with your money?" This 2016 book will be available on reserve at Literati or may be obtained through the usual other sources.

Dec 11: We conclude our semester of studying stewardship by looking at one man's late-life understanding of himself in relation to the world. We will read Joseph Cardinal Bernardin's *"The Gift of Peace."* This may be available on reserve at Literati but is certainly available in both new and used formats through the usual sources.

WINTER: This winter the Catholic Thinkers Book Club will be looking at issues of early Church history, focusing a lot of attention on Saint Paul.

Jan 8: We will start off with Karen Armstrong's 2015 book (only 143 pages) *"Saint Paul: The Apostle We Love to Hate."* Copies of this book will be on reserve at Literati or you may obtain it through any of the other usual sources.

Feb 12: We will continue our study of early church history by taking a deep dive into the thought and ongoing influence of St. Paul in Garry Wills' 2006 book *"What Paul Meant."* Copies will be available on reserve at Literati, or you may obtain this book through your usual sources.

Mar 12: We are starting off Lent by reading Nikos Kazantzakis' novel *"The Last Temptation of Christ,"* a reinterpretation of the Gospels that fleshes out Christ's Passion. Copies will be available on reserve at Literati or may be obtained through the usual sources.

Apr 9: The Catholic Thinkers Book Club will conclude its semester about early Church history by reading Elaine Pagels' *"The Gnostic Gospels."* We will provide updates about where copies may be obtained.

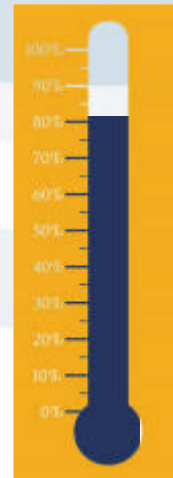
