### TRANSFORMATIONAL EXPERIENCE AT SMSP BY AMELIA GRIFFITH



“Go to church!” was one of the last things my mom reminded me to do the very first time she and my dad dropped me off on campus. I nodded dutifully, but I only made it to a 10 AM Mass at St. Mary one time during my first month of school.

It wasn't that I didn't want to go to Mass – it was that I didn't want to get up for Mass. I'm not a morning person, and mindlessly assumed that as was in my small hometown, Mass here would only be offered in the morning. Without parents nagging me to get up, it was too easy to hit the snooze button and go back to sleep instead.

At the end of September that year, I saw an email advertising the final days to sign up for the Big/Little program at SMSP. I was not even a little bit enthused by the idea and remain convinced it was not of my own convictions, but rather of those of the Holy Spirit that I filled out that Google form. I was paired with a kind and caring sister in Christ who encouraged me to come to Mass at 9:00 PM.

At St. Mary, I was welcomed into a community where I feel fully known and loved. I've been able to get to know fellow students and our campus ministers as we've planned Ig.nite and

special events, and I've been on ASB trips to Louisville and Baltimore. One of my most transformational experiences, however, was last year, as a student catechist in the Family Faith Formation program.

This responsibility was overwhelming. I didn't feel I was qualified to teach a sweet bunch of fourth graders about a faith I felt I still had so much to learn about. I was familiar with our faith's basic foundations, but I still felt like I was standing on shaky ground. It felt like a lot at first, to somehow fit all of the Beatitudes into one session, and the Ten Commandments into another. I was also asked a lot of questions I had no idea how to answer.

What I learned as a catechist, however, was how much beauty there was in all of this. God moves us in phenomenal ways, especially when it is to gather in His name and to share in His word. Our first lesson was about who God was and what God meant to us, and I remember being filled with so much joy as we got to engage in nourishing conversation about where we saw God in our lives. Right before my eyes was the future church, and I was left in this kind of wondrous awe of not only of their curiosity, but also of their intelligence, understanding, and their unshakeable beliefs in God.

As a catechist, I feel I've learned twice as much as I taught. My faith was

renewed as I bore witness to these children of God coming together, and using their newfound theological knowledge for something bigger – seeing and knowing and listening to God in their lives. I want to encourage all of our students to prayerfully consider this opportunity to help build up the Kingdom of God.

## FAITH FORMATION FOR 3-5 YEAR OLDS

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with the materials on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite children ages 3-5 years who are either in preschool or young 5s programs to participate. This faith formation opportunity will be held once a month after the 10:00 AM Mass from 11:15 AM-12:45 PM (September 23, October 14, November 4, December 9 with 2019 dates TBD). It is a drop-off program. Materials cost is \$35 per child for the year and scholarships are available. ## CROP HUNGER WALK



Join us for the 44th Annual Ann Arbor CROP Hunger Walk on Sunday, Sept. 30th. CROP

Hunger Walks are community-wide events sponsored by Church World Service to raise funds to end hunger and poverty in the U.S. and around the world. More than 1,600 walks take place across the U.S. annually - this historic Ann Arbor 5K walk has happened annually since 1975 and has raised a total of over \$3 million. Last year, over 300 individuals walked and raised over \$25,000.

75% of funds raised will be granted to Church World Service and their partner agencies. The remaining 25% will be granted to various local hunger and poverty relief organizations. Additionally at the event, we will be collecting non-perishable food items which will be donated to a local food pantry.

Registration for the walk begins at 1:00 PM, send-off service and walk begin at 2:00 PM at St. Clare's Episcopal Church, 2309 Packard Street, in Ann Arbor.

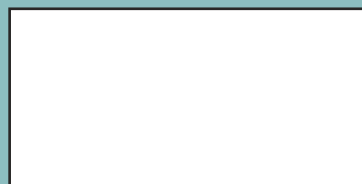
