## Pastoral Perspective

### ALTERNATIVE SPRING BREAK (ASB)

*ASB is a week-long opportunity for undergraduate students interested in serving others, meeting new people, living in solidarity, and putting their faith into action! Below is a reflection from Travis Dantzer, who served last year in Nicaragua, and will be serving as a site leader for the El Salvador immersion:*



I've heard from people wiser than myself that asking the right questions is more important than knowing answers. The following

questions are a reflection I wrote after our second day of helping to build a house in a village near Granada, Nicaragua.

"Why did God send me on this ASB? I always know the answer. I am well-informed, put together, I've got it figured out. But how much of that is because of where I'm from, who I am in the merely demographic sense?

Is the level of organization in my life a result of valiant efforts to clear through wilderness, or because I was born into order and prosperity?

How diligent am I doing homework on a dirt floor? How politically idealistic am I when I've lost cousins, uncles, and grandparents to slogans and ideologies?

How smart am I when I'm ignorant? When I don't know the history, or geography, or the culture. What do I have to say that's worth saying?

What can I say [in Spanish]? Quite little. Little I would consider talking about back home. Chit-chat, silly questions, observations that must seem inane to the fluent. Nothing I would think was worth saying back home.

What's the value in a sentence? Is it what I'm saying, or that I'm saying something, or that I'm listening?

There have been times I've been forced to listen. It is often so difficult for me to understand another language I can't spend mental energy trying to come up with a response. It is often so difficult for me to understand another person that I can do nothing but listen.

If I have learned one thing from this trip it will have been worth every dollar, every hour, every missed day on the beach. If I've really learned to listen, without interrupting, or suggesting, or correcting, I've gotten far more than I wanted or could have expected."

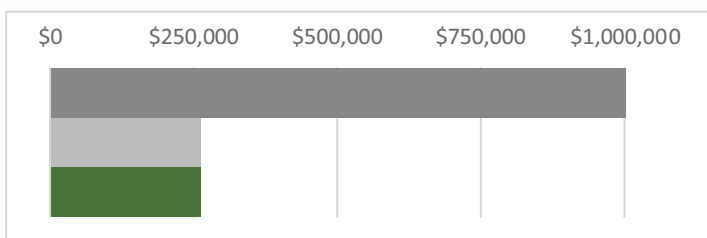
