Pastoral Perspective

Sacred Stories: A Past Intern's Reflection

A year ago, I found myself standing in front of friends, strangers, fellow parishioners, those whom I had asked to our event, and still others whose names I may never know. A year ago, God gave me the strength to open and share my faith story. A year ago, on a Sunday evening I was vulnerable with my closest friends and complete strangers - all in communion with the twelve interns of my dynamic, faith-filled cohort. A year ago, the twelve of us shared each of our unique, beautiful faith journeys.

As an intern, we were called on a Sunday evening to share our own Spiritual Autobiography. We began in prayer as a community, and then guests were able to listen to the stories of joy, suffering, highs, lows, hope, and fortitude. That Sunday in January, the interns found the beauty of witnessing our faith in a public manner - some interns speaking on behalf of their faith as they had done many times before, myself and others opening up about experiences we may have not shared in a public setting before. The result was a beautiful, honest expression of the power of God's work in our lives.

Next Sunday, November 18th, this year's interns will share their own Sacred Stories. Through a reflection of their own individual faith stories, they focus on the fact that it is Christ's being - His Sacred Story - that links our own individual sacred stories together. During the evening, each attendee will have the opportunity to read over the program, meet the interns, and select three stories to attend. I highly encourage you to join the St. Mary community in Donnelly Hall at 6:15pm to hear the Sacred Stories of the interns and to reflect on your own Sacred Story, what God reveals to us through our own unique faith journey, and how we encounter God at work in our lives.

During my faith story, I referenced the Gospel spoken that day in Matthew 4:19-20: "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. And they straightway left their nets, and followed him." Hearing the stories of my fellow interns, and challenging myself to claim my faith journey as my own, has helped me to see my life as a sacred story. My story is not perfect, it's messy, it has its own highs and lows. Yet, we are all called, every day, to this discipleship. We are called to trust in God and to listen for the ways of gratitude, peace, joy, and even consolation in which he communicates with us.

On Sunday, the interns will take a step forward to follow Christ as they open their hearts to our community. I invite you to reflect on your own Sacred Story, pray for the interns as they prepare for this evening, and join us as we listen to God at work through their Sacred Stories.


