BEING INSTRUMENTS OF JESUS' LOVE, MERCY, COMPASSION AND JUSTICE

I found myself this past weekend sauntering over to the Advent gift baskets here in our atrium after Masses. I was moved to see parents

explaining to their children the concept about giving a Christmas gift to someone in greater need than themselves. One young girl selected a note requesting a Barbie doll, and her younger brother picked the gift of blocks. It's beautiful to see so many of you are fulfilling your commitment as parents to raise your children in our faith.

The season of Advent is my favorite. We hear about angels in our readings, and all of us at St. Mary have had angels in our lives, the reason we are here. We have had messengers sent by God to announce that God is with us. Through grandparents, parents, family, and friends, we have heard and seen angels who have brought us to Jesus and nurtured our friendship with Him. Advent is a time to thank God for the angels of our lives and the gift of our faith.

We're also called to bring Jesus to others. Just as Mary and Joseph responded in faith, "let your will be done", we too are asked to do the same. I am sure Mary and Joseph had long nights attending to their son,

Your faith, your yes that I see every week, deepens my own faith and desire to continue to say yes to God, let your will be done.

In these dark days of December, we prepare to celebrate Christmas. My prayer is to be able to see and hear anew angels from on high, and to be grateful for God's intimate and abiding presence. I pray that this season can deepen our desire to be part of God's plan of redemption, bringing Christ's message to the world. May we be instruments of

Jesus' love, mercy, compassion and justice for all we meet along the way especially to those who are in need of love and compassion. May we prepare to make Christmas merry for others in our love and kindness, as simple as some blocks, a Barbie doll, or a warm sleeping bag.





BRIEF REPORT: AFTERNOON OF LISTENING AND CONVERSATION

On Sunday, November 4, 2018, St. Mary parishioners were invited to participate in an afternoon of listening and conversation regarding the sexual abuse crisis within the Catholic Church. This event sought to give parishioners an opportunity to reflect on how the crisis has impacted their faith lives, and to express what hopes they have for St. Mary and for the global Church moving forward.

Below is a brief summary of some of the hopes expressed by over 60 parishioners that attended. A more comprehensive summary can be found on the parish website.

HOPES FOR ST. MARY AND OUR UNIVERSAL CHURCH AS WE MOVE FORWARD FROM THIS CRISIS

- 1. We hope that the laity work to find plans of action to have a voice with the local church, the diocese, and the Vatican.
- 2. We hope the children and parents in our church and diocese are provided better training to detect signs of abuse and that the children know they are taken seriously.
- 3. We hope for greater transparency and accountability from the hierarchy. Victims deserve an apology. There can be no more cover-ups.
- 4. We hope for healing for the victims and all impacted by this crisis. We hope the Church does all it can to bring about that healing.
