

Pastoral Perspective

"OUR MOTHER AND THE MOTHER OF JESUS CHRIST"

Magda Avalos has been a St Mary parishioner for twelve years. Each year, for the nine days prior to the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, she wakes up early to pray the novena to Our Mother, together with other St. Mary parishioners. Beginning in candlelight at the back of the Church, these parishioners sing traditional Guadalupana songs to Our Lady. They journey together towards Mary (whose image is placed on the altar) just as a young Juan Diego journeyed up the mount to meet her centuries ago. They sing good morning to her, and the lights come up, for dawn has broken! Then they pray the rosary, and eventually sing their good-byes to Mary. It is a beautiful and intimate prayer experience that happens in these quiet morning hours.

Every year, Magda also participates in our Aztecan Dances to the Virgen - a much louder, but equally beautiful Guadalupana prayer experience. Magda helps to lead and organize the dancers in their practices for the months leading up to December 12, which is no small feat, as most of the dancers are young children newly learning these important traditions. Regardless of age, they practice hard to ensure that Mary is joyfully celebrated in the Feast Day mass.

After all, Mary has chosen to appear to the humble and the marginalized, and has empowered an indigenous boy to intercede on her behalf. What a message of hope Mary brought to her people that day, and continues to bring us every day! This is why Magda wakes up early to pray, why she spends countless hours practicing the dances, and why she hands her traditions down to the next generation. Below are some of Magda's translated reflections on the importance of Our Lady in her life:

"Our Mother and the Mother of Jesus Christ.

Our Lady, the Virgen of Guadalupe.

She appeared on December 12, in the year 1531. She chose a humble, indigenous man, Juan Diego, to intercede for her before the bishop of those times, so that he would build a temple on the hill of Tepeyac. Her arrival fills us with great joy, as we have her as our protector of all lay Catholics.

Personally, I feel blessed because on July 21, 2012, Our Mother Mary of Guadalupe appeared in one of the windows at my house. It has been a beautiful experience. Many people have had the blessing of being able to appreciate this beautiful image. I don't have the words to express this blessing of welcoming her in my home."

Come join us tomorrow, Tuesday and/ or Wednesday morning at 6:30am for the remaining days of the novena, Las Mañanitas, in the Church. You are also welcome to the mass on Our Lady's Feast – Wednesday, December 12. Music begins at 6:30pm, the mass at 7pm, and the reception after.

These experiences are all in Spanish, but there are guides provided. They are very visual prayer experiences, and no Spanish is required to appreciate our parish community and Our Mother, the Mother of Jesus Christ!




