Chatting with my mother this past week, she casually stated that regarding Christmas presents, I was hard to shop for.

Perhaps she was looking for some clues, but it struck me as odd because she's given me everything I've ever wanted.

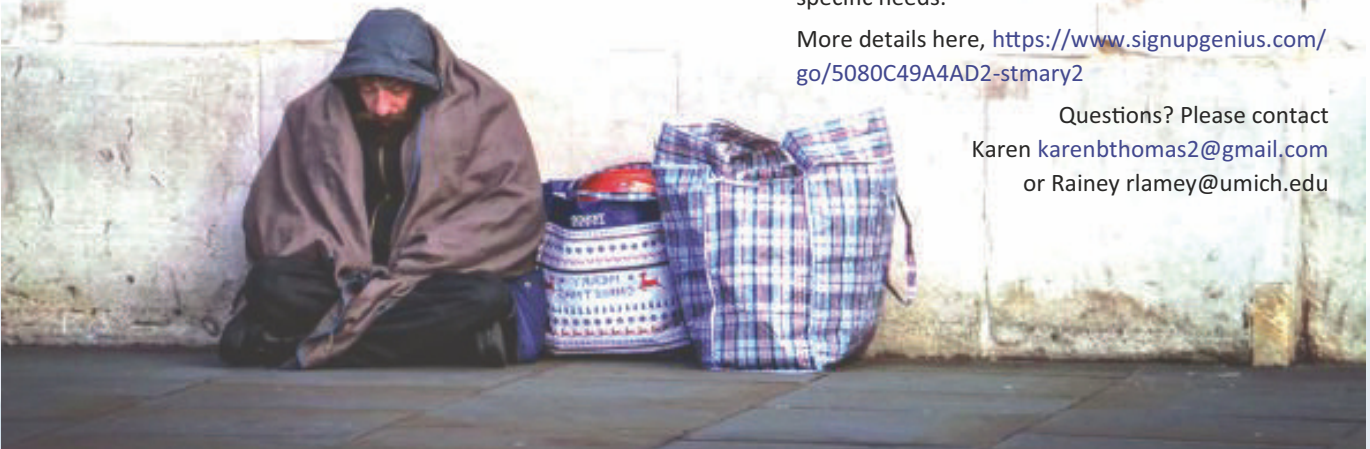

INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms for one child only on most Sundays at 10:00 am, 12 noon and 5:00 pm. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2pm Spanish mass.

THE FEAST DAY OF SERVICE

Thank you to all who participated in our parish Feast Day of Service this past weekend. This year, our parish set a number of records. We increased our participation by more than 75% from last year, as we sent over 246 people from our parish into the community to serve with 17 different charities and nonprofits from Flint to Detroit! A large part of this increase in our numbers is thanks to record participation from our Hispanic and Latino community, as we were able to partner with 11 bilingual service sites.

With your help, we were also able to deliver two truckloads of donations, amongst the largest collection of items of any congregation, to the Jewish Family Services Refugee Resettlement program. These donations are not only much needed to help establish warm and welcoming homes for incoming refugee families, but the sheer volume of items also demonstrates our parish's interest in supporting this worthy program and our willingness to stand in solidarity with the refugee families in our community.

This year included our first inaugural "teach-in", where families were able to learn about and take positive action to combat certain injustices surrounding migration in this country, as well as stand in greater solidarity with refugees, asylum seekers, and migrants both in our community and around the world.

Through your efforts, we were able to send a petition to President Trump with 46 signatures, expressing our parish's strong support for resettling refugees in the United States and demanding that he resettle at least 75,000 refugees in the coming fiscal year; send 90 letters to our elected representatives demonstrating our parish's support for the Share the Journey global migration campaign led by Pope Francis, and advocating for poverty-reducing international assistance; decorate and send over 100 postcards to refugee children around the world through Jesuit Refugee Service's "Any Refugee" campaign; and finally, make over 280 Christmas cards for local veterans which will be distributed through the Sending Smiles to Vets program.

We could not have accomplished what we did without your help. Thank you again!

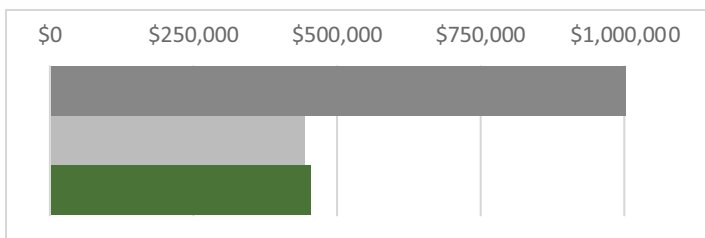
