## **Pastoral Perspective**

#### **EVERY PERSON ON THIS EARTH IS IMPORTANT**

This Sunday's readings focus in on the concept of many parts, but one body. The second reading tells us to then

remember that each person is an individual part of the body of Christ. As the daughter of an immigrant family, I keep this reading close to my heart to remind myself that every person on this Earth is has a purpose. Every person on this Earth is important.

With this thought in mind, I can't help but draw attention to my own involvement within the parish. I work with the ST. MARY IMMIGRATION TEAM because every person, no matter where he or she may come from, has the right to strive for a better life. The immigration team connects with immigrant families, especially Hispanic ones within the parish. We join together as allied brothers and sisters who reflect God's love to each other and support individuals and families through the sometimes harsh immigration system.

Growing up, my family always made an effort to visit our family that is still in Nicaragua as much as possible. However, with the current political climate in Nicaragua, that hasn't been possible for us recently. Nicaragua has been undergoing a tumultuous time of violent riots against the oppressive dictatorship. Despite my relatives' attempts to leave, U.S. immigration

laws are just too strict and difficult for it to be possible for them.

As a part of the immigration team, I was given the opportunity to meet a Nicaraguan immigrant named Mario. This man has been through a lot while trying to come to the United States, and the immigration team jumped at the opportunity to help. After being put in a detention center by ICE on a technicality, the St. Mary immigration support team was ready to help.

Volunteer drivers drove to ensure that everything was set with ICE and to pick up Mario from the detention center and bring him back to his temporary home in Ann Arbor while he waited to fly out to his new home in Washington, D.C. My family then came up to Ann Arbor and we took him out to eat and to the UMMA, while my grandparents sympathized with him and answered any of his questions about their personal immigration experience. Keeping this man company and listening to his story truly connected me back to my roots and reminded me why I do this.

Scripture teaches us that we should welcome every person with love and compassion. How then, are we to be compassionate, if we do not accept immigrants with open arms and help them throughout their struggles? Not only am I personally connected with an empathy for immigrants, but I believe that the very foundation of our Catholic faith teaches that we must do all that we can to help our brothers and sisters in Christ. Just as a foot, a hand, an eye and an ear are all

valuable parts of the human body; every person on this planet is a valuable part of the body of Christ.

#### INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms for one child only on most Sundays at 10:00 am, 12 noon and 5:00 pm. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2:00 PM Spanish mass.


