WE ARE PROPHETS FOR EACH OTHER

And Jesus said,
"Amen, I say to you,
no prophet is
accepted in his own
native place."

In today's Gospel from Luke, people are literally trying to

run Jesus over a cliff because they don't like what he tells them. It seems that he is claiming to be the long-awaited Messiah. Also, he reminds them that even the great prophets before him faced opposition. Elijah and Elisha couldn't work their miracles in Israel either, so they went elsewhere to do them.

Jesus escapes the chaos this time because he has so much more to do. He's just getting started in teaching us about the Kingdom of God. Of course, this work continues with us, today, and right here. So who are the prophets among us that we ignore or drive away?

In the Hebrew Scriptures, the prophets were people who reminded the Israelites of God's loving covenant, and of their need to stay faithful. They proclaimed a message of deliverance and offered people hope.

In our day, too, God speaks to us through other people. This parish is filled with disciples of Christ who have much to say about their own experiences of God. One good way that we share our experiences is through our Small Church Communities. These groups allow us to break open the Word together, and to see the unique

ways that God meets each of us in our lives and in our prayer.

My experiences in small groups have helped me to grow closer to fellow parishioners, but also to be in awe most of the time at the way our friends and neighbors are living and experiencing their faith. We all have things we carry in life. It's inspiring and humbling to hear how God helps us to bear the load.

We are prophets for each other and it's good to hear these current-day messages of deliverance and hope.

With that in mind, I hope you'll consider joining one of the many SCC groups available during Lent (I know, it seems like we just finished the Christmas season). Groups will begin studying the Sunday readings the week of February 25. SCC groups will meet once a week during Lent and offer a great opportunity for deeper Lenten prayer and reflection.

This Lent, you may choose to give something up, but you can also add something important. Joining a small group can help you enrich your prayer life and look at different perspectives on the readings.

Fr. James Martin likes to point out that faith sharing "is a terrific encouragement" in the spiritual life. "Often it's easier to see God's work in others, than in yourself. Likewise, others can often point out God's activity in your life when you aren't able to notice it."

I hope you can spend a little time in thought and prayer about your

upcoming Lenten practices, and about the possibility of adding a small group to your spiritual life.

Note: The Lent SCC groups will run the weeks of Feb. 25 through April 14. Signup will be online and we'll be sending out notice of a link soon. We are also in need of small group facilitators to ensure that we have enough groups to meet everyone's needs.

Parish Security

As a part of the vibrant downtown Ann Arbor community, we recognize the need to provide both a welcoming and secure environment. As such, we've been working over the last few months to implement new features at our Thompson Street entrance.

The first is enabling the two sets of glass doors to open at the push of a button, improving access for those with special mobility needs such as wheel chairs, strollers, etc.

The second is increased security for our students, staff, and parishioners. We have installed a new security system with several cameras and while we are testing it for the first few days, the Thompson Street entrance and the doors to the parish office will be locked. After the trial period, we will begin to limit access to the parish as follows:

During normal business hours, 9:00 AM - 6:00 PM, our main entrance on Thompson Street will be open, but the doors to the parish offices and Newman Lounge will be locked. There is a small black box just outside the entrance that houses a camera, which the front office staff can use to communicate with those looking to gain entry to the parish. Students coming to the parish after 6:00 PM will be able to download an app to their smartphone and can simply swipe in.

- After 6:00 PM, the main entrance on Thompson Street will also be locked.
- On Wednesdays, the Thompson Street entrance will remain open for reconciliation and will be locked at 6:45 PM.
- On Sundays, building entrances will remain open, as will the doors to the parish office.

While you may not feel an increased security presence on Sundays, our new cameras will provide increased security everyday. Cameras have been installed in the church, atrium, building entrances, and in the courtyard.

As always, the safety of our students, parishioners, staff, and visitors is our top priority. We appreciate your patience while our community gets to know our new system.
