YOUR FAITH CAN MOVE MOUNTAINS

Before I started my internship at St. Mary Student Parish, I received the advice "God doesn't call the qualified -

He qualifies the called."
I was a little overwhelmed applying and being offered the Special Events
Internship back in May: who was I to

become a student leader at a Church?

I had just gotten back into my faith, and many, including myself, wondered if this renewal of faith was just a phase. Yet, by the grace of God, I pushed those thoughts aside, and into the internship I went.

Throughout the year, I learned about my faith life and my professional life. I gained confidence in not only realizing my strengths, but having those strengths affirmed by the people I care most about. Developing my Sacred Story, or a 15-minute summary of my faith life, allowed me to reflect on how I got to this present moment. Bi-weekly formation sessions with the other interns allowed us to check-in with one another and reflect on how God has moved in us that week.

I vividly remember my first Special Event: St. Mary's Annual Root Beer Pong tournament. I had no idea what to expect going in, how I was going to lead this event, how to even measure what constituted a "successful Special Event". But seeing smiles and laughter at that event, from the daily regulars who hang in the lounge to the new students looking to just play pong and eat free dinner, filled me with such joy. That image has motivated me throughout the entire year, with events such as karaoke, the Christmas party, and the luau allowing students to find rest in the craziness of their schedules.

Even from something as simple as belting the Moana soundtrack with the St. Mary's community, I learned that the Holy Spirit wants to work through us in ways we never imagined. All we must do is call upon Him, and He will move forward. The times I've seen the Holy Spirit work through my 11 other interns have been such a blessing. Each intern is perfectly placed in their position, and the positive impact they've brought to this parish and to my life is overwhelming. One of the highlights of my year was getting to know these people fully, whether it's in planning monthly co/mission leadership nights together or playing endless games of Euchre in the lounge.

I'm sure most of the other interns have never realized the "impact moments" they've had in my life – revealing how fully capable everyone is to be a student leader at St. Mary's. If you are worried you are not "good enough" or "spiritual enough" to apply for the internship, I beg you to send those thoughts away. The

chances to grow in this role, both individually and as a community, are too moving to pass up. With an amazing staff, an amazing God on your side, and an openness to grow, your faith can move mountains.

THE "WHAT SHOULD I DO?" RETREAT

MAKING DECISIONS WITH THE WISDOM OF ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

"What should I do?" In a sense, it is the question we ask ourselves. It applies to everyday situations and major life choices. We know it is important to make good decisions, but we often don't know how.

Fortunately, there's help. St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, was a master decision maker. His "rules for discernment" have helped countless people make good decisions for nearly 500 years.

This retreat is aimed at undergraduate students, graduate students, and young professionals. It is designed to offer much insight but also fit in a busy schedule.

The retreat will take place at St. Mary during the evening of Friday, March 29 and the day of Saturday, March 30.

Retreatants will return to their residences on Friday night, and after coming back on Saturday, the retreat will conclude by 5:00 PM.

The retreat will consist of a series of talks, each of which will be followed by some time for reflection. On Friday, there will also be Eucharistic adoration and Reconciliation. Mass will be offered on Saturday.

Fr. Michael Rossmann, S.J., the organizer of this retreat, was ordained a priest in 2017. He serves as a vocation promoter for the Jesuits and works with people in discernment across the Midwest. He started the "One-Minute Homily," a video series on social media through The Jesuit Post. Fr. Rossmann is a graduate of a Catholic university in South Bend, IN that shall remain nameless. He wisely decided not to visit Michigan during the football season.

INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms for one child only on most Sundays at 10:00 am, 12 noon and 5:00 pm. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2:00 PM Spanish mass.


