I've been a bit preoccupied lately, saddened to learn that Sister Clare Hennessey passed away last week. Sr. Clare was a Sister of Mercy and my fourth grade teacher at St. John Regional School in Concord, N.H. With a dedicated faculty and small class sizes, my time as a student

at St. John's shaped my life in meaningful ways. Being one of Sr. Clare's students had a profound impact on me, my sister and all of our friends.

Sr. Clare was stern yet sensitive, challenging and encouraging. She was joyful—filled with the Spirit—and loved to sing. She taught us to worship through song, to sing for the glory of God. She wore long skirts with deep pockets, and always carried a pitch pipe. Our class spent almost as much time singing hymns as we spent studying or practicing penmanship. I still delight thinking of her joy when we would sing, and recalling these fond memories is comforting.

The people and experiences that bring us closer to God are blessings in our lives. They are beautiful gifts.

Each day at work at St. Mary, I get to witness these blessings—connections, relationships and experiences that fill us with the Spirit. I see a campus minister and student returning from a walk deep in conversation. I see my intern, Matt, grow as a leader and a young man strong in his faith. I see families with children who are coming to know Jesus or preparing for the sacraments. I see marginalized members of our community welcomed and assisted by our service ministries. I see participants return from retreat or Alternative Spring Break on fire for Christ.

Our Parish Council voted to join the Washtenaw Congregational Sanctuary Coalition. This is a coalition of Churches formed to address the escalating numbers of deportations of undocumented immigrants. Our Immigration Team has already been involved. This work falls under our mission to live a faith that seeks justice. This is also in line with the new Universal Apostolic Priorities for the Society of Jesus.

Pope Francis approved the Universal Apostolic Preferences of the Society of Jesus, 2019-2019 on February 6, 2019. The four apostolic preferences are:

- To show the way to God through the Spiritual Exercises and discernment:
- To walk with the poor, the outcast of the world. those whose dignity has been violated, in a mission of reconciliation and justice;
- To accompany young people in the creation of a hope-filled future;
- To collaborate in the care of our Common Home.

As we move towards March Madness, we had another donor come forward with a \$10,000 gift. That brings our total to \$30,000. With a few more donors, we can reach our goal of \$50,000 as the seed money to be matched. All these funds go to help our Campus Ministry. Thanks to our generous donors.


