Pastoral Perspective

JESUS MEETS US WHERE WE ARE

Jesus meets us where we are.

That's what stands out for me in today's parable of the prodigal son (Luke 15: 1-32). We see a loving and worried father who runs out to meet the son that had rejected him.

"While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him and was filled with compassion."

This line tells us that the father must have been waiting for him. I picture him day after day, looking down the road in expectation of his son's footsteps. Sometimes we all feel a long way off. We head out on our own, moving away from God – from the home that offers nourishment and abundance. But God doesn't hold us in our bad choices. He runs to us, and always meets us exactly where we are.

This parable is particularly special for me. Each fall, we reflect on the prodigal son story with our RCIA candidates, those who are exploring the idea of becoming Catholic. We look at this story with an emphasis on their own journeys toward God, and toward a spiritual place that will feel like home for them.

I'm always honored to see how this reading calls out so many feelings and insights among the group. We can all relate to one of the characters. We can all feel such comfort and peace when we realize how precious we are, no matter what the circumstances. God meets us where we are.

Does any of us "deserve" this kind of love and tenderness? No. How many

times have we moved away from God through our self-absorbed choices, or our indifference? But this story reminds us that we are not held in our sins. We are not excluded from the warm embrace of that rich, extravagant cloak. We can always "come to our senses," as the son did. We can always come home.

The readings for these weeks of Lent express beautiful images of renewal, new growth, forgiveness and new possibilities. Our 17 RCIA candidates have been living and experiencing this as well. They are learning and preparing with great intensity and commitment. As a parish, may we lift

them up with continued prayers and with admiration for the joy and growth they are experiencing through Christ.

Like the fig tree in last week's gospel, our group has experienced the gardener's care and attention. They have been nourished and fed through community, and through God's word. Soon, they will join us in the deeper nourishment of the Eucharist on Holy Saturday.

"So stop wandering around. Instead, come home and trust that God will bring you what you need." (Henri Nouwen, The Inner Voice of Love.)

Who or what helped you to return home?


What keeps me from running toward fullness of life in Jesus Christ? What can I do about it?


