



RED CLOUD VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

Red Cloud Indian School is seeking applicants for the 2019-2020 Red Cloud Volunteer Program cohort. Red Cloud Volunteers work for and with the Oglala Lakota people for justice in education on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota.

Red Cloud Volunteers serve primarily as **teachers** while also earning a commercial driver's license (CDL) and driving school buses, assist with after-school activities and coaching, and serve Red Cloud in various other capacities. Volunteers share life with fellow volunteers in intentional communities of 6-10, and volunteer life is shaped by the program pillars of: Justice in Education, Spirituality, Community and Living Simply

Although previous educational experience is valued, this is not a requirement.

Red Cloud Volunteers receive: room and board, monthly stipend, health insurance (including vision and dental), access to a shared vehicle, opportunities for spiritual formation (including retreats and days of reflection), Although our AmeriCorps grant is not guaranteed from year to year, most volunteers also serve concurrently as part-time AmeriCorps volunteers.

The term of service is one school year (July 2019-May 2020), and may be renewed for up to two additional school years.

We are currently seeking volunteers to fill the following positions: High School Social Studies Teacher, High School Activities Director, and Middle School English Teacher.

INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms for one child only on most Sundays at 10:00 am, 12 noon and 5:00 pm. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2:00 PM Spanish mass.

BAPTISM CLASS DATES: ATTEND ONE CLASS ONLY May 20, Jun 24, Jul 29, Aug 19, Sept 30, Oct 28, Nov 11 and Dec 9.

WILLIAM STREET BIKEWAY

The Ann Arbor Downtown Development Authority (DDA) will begin work on Ann Arbor's first protected bike lane this month. This two-way protected bike lane will be installed on the north side of William Street, right outside St. Mary's front door!

The protected lane will run from State Street to First Street, transitioning to an advisory bike lane from First Street to Fourth Street. The project will also include much needed road resurfacing, water main consolidation, and reconfiguration of vehicle travel lanes in some locations to eliminate the confusing lane shifts currently on William.



Work will begin in early May, and the estimated schedule is as follows:

May – July: Division to State (work will be completed

before the Art Fair)

July - August: Fifth to Division

September - October: Ashley to Main

October: First to Division (final road resurfacing &

bikeway installation)

HOW TO REPORT ABUSE


