FINDING GOD AT THE ART FAIR

Our first summer in Ann Arbor, my husband and I were renting an extremely cute, albeit tiny house on Murray Ave on the Old West Side. What a fantastic location as young professionals. We could walk to every restaurant and bar downtown, take our puppy on long walks through Wurster and West parks, and truly continue our urban lifestyle we left behind in Chicago.

We invited my parents to come and stay with us for the Art Fair that first summer we lived on Murray Ave. For us, the Art Fair was truly a novelty. Four days of fantastic art that we could browse from our doorstep! And did I mention my office (St. Mary) was closed for the entire fair?!

As we walked the rows and rows of Art, my father noted just how many people doing the same thing as us. As we passed St. Mary, he noted that closing the parish was a missed opportunity. Thousands of people walking right by our parish - and we're closed?!

As much as I enjoyed having the time off from work, I saw his point. As Catholics, we strive to meet people where they are. In campus ministry, this means going on-campus and meeting students. In our lives, this means showing up for friends in need, reaching out to the marginalized, and raising our children with love and attention.

And none of this happens within the walls of our church.

However, during the four glorious days of Art Fair, thousands of people DO flock to our church unaware of their invitation to find God.

What will they find when they walk by?

In the years since, I've led an amazing group of staff and volunteers to serve in our Art Fair tent and assist with Sunday parking. The outcome has been nothing short of fantastic: reconnecting with couples who were married here 50 years ago, meeting incoming freshmen, and simply selling those iconic Michigan Catholics t-shirts.

This year, however, my husband and I are preparing to welcome our second child at the end of June. We're a "surprise" family, so we don't know the gender - but we know our 18 month old son Jack will be an amazing big brother.

So while I'm already preparing for another successful Art Fair, I won't be able to oversee the execution. I have many great students and staff members already signed up to help manage the event, but I would like to extend a special invitation to those who have volunteered before to sign-up again this year, and encourage any of you who are interested to sign-up as well.

INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms for one child only on most Sundays at 10:00 am, 12 noon and 5:00 pm. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2:00 PM Spanish mass.

Come join us for three evenings of film, discussion, and fellowship!


This summer's film festival-themed "Visitation" offers films exploring themes of visitation, home, and who is welcoming whom in a theocentric life.

Family Faith Formation Registration

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION (FFF) AND TEEN CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

Registration has begun for ALL SMSP parish members for our FFF Programs: Pre-K through 7th Grade and Teen Confirmation, which is 8th Grade (High school students are welcome). Parish members whose eldest child will be 3-4 years of age as of Sept. 1, 2019 are eligible for our Pre-K classes.

REGISTRATION FOR NON-PARISH MEMBERS WILL BEGIN ON JULY 1, 2019

Family Faith Formation

This home-based program requires families to work together at home on lessons. Families meet one Sunday a month at the parish to build community and grow in faith formation and discipleship. We offer three sessions from October thru April: 8AM, 10AM and a Noon Session. In keeping with our SMSP Mission ten hours of volunteer service at SMSP per family is required. Regular Sunday Mass attendance is expected.

1st Reconciliation/1st Communion

This program includes attendance at all FFF Sundays as well as one additional Sunday Parent/Child session per month in preparation for the Sacraments.

Teen Confirmation

Sacramental Preparation sessions will meet twice a month on Sunday afternoons. Attendance at the Fall Retreat and two Service Retreats are required in addition to regular attendance at Sunday Mass.

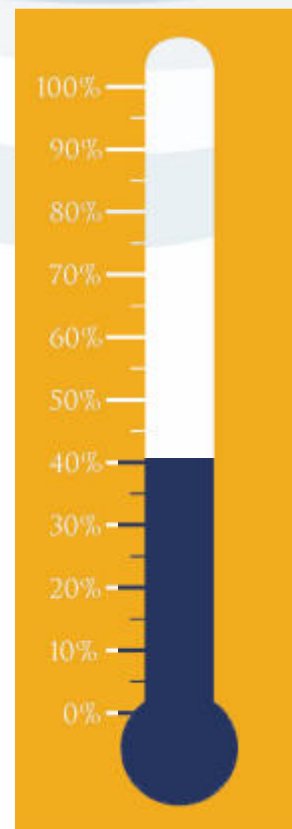
Everyone is invited to a reception to say good-bye to Fr. Richard D'Souza. He is leaving Ann Arbor to go back to his work in Rome.

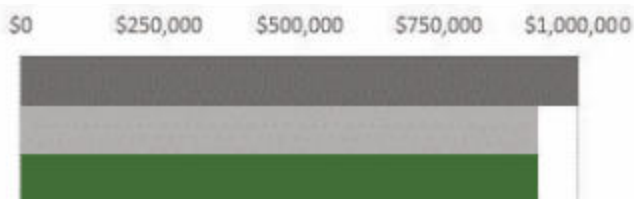
