

Pastoral Perspective

EXPANDING SMSP'S MUSIC MINISTRY

I have been blessed to work at St. Mary Student Parish as the Music Coordinator for just over a year now, and I have to say, we have a wonderfully vocal congregation! It is an amazing thing to feel God's presence in so many voices raised in song every Mass.

There is a line in the second reading for June 30th that rings loudly in my ears: "Serve one another through love" (Galatians 5:14). Every week, members of our Music Ministry gather before Mass to rehearse in fellowship and love for the Lord. They then stand at the front of the sanctuary to pray the best way that they know how- through music. St. Augustine is credited with saying, "When we sing, we pray twice" and I fully believe that our parish prays everything twice through song, and that we are loving our neighbor the best way we can while we are gathered in His name.

Part of our responsibility as members of the universal Church is to join our brothers and sisters in Christ by following the liturgical calendar. We are striving for continuity within the larger church, and in doing so, we are moving towards highlighting the distinction of the liturgical seasons throughout the calendar year. This is typically done through the church's decor (which is always amazingly beautiful!) and the vestments that our priests wear (green for Ordinary Time, purple for Advent and Lent, and white for Easter and Christmas).

We are moving as a Music Ministry to mirror that distinction by changing our Mass Settings with the liturgical calendar. The Mass Settings include the Gospel Acclamation, the "Holy, Holy," "Mystery of Faith," and "Amen" from the Eucharist Rite, and the Lamb of God. As you may have noticed, we have recently changed to our Ordinary Time Mass Setting which is "Mass for the Healing of

the World" by David Haas. We will continue to sing the favorited Gloria from Haas' "Mass of Light," as well.

Looking forward, when Ordinary Time ends at the end of November, we will signify that change by changing to the "Mass for the Healing of the World" by Trevor Thompson. Our choir directors will prepare the congregation in the weeks beforehand so that we can continue to include every member of our parish as we raise our voices to glorify God's name.

Lastly, I would like to invite those who enjoy music to join one of our Mass ensembles! We are always looking for voices and instruments to add to our "joyful noise" (Psalm 100:1). FAMILY FAITH FORMATION (FFF) AND TEEN CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

Registration has begun for ALL SMSP parish members for our FFF Programs: Pre-K through 7th Grade and Teen Confirmation, which is 8th Grade (High school students are welcome). Parish members whose eldest child will be 3-4 years of age as of Sept. 1, 2019 are eligible for our Pre-K classes.

REGISTRATION FOR NON-PARISH MEMBERS WILL BEGIN ON JULY 1, 2019

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

This home-based program requires families to work together at home on lessons. Families meet one Sunday a month at the parish to build community and grow in faith formation and discipleship. We offer three sessions from October thru April: 8AM, 10AM and a Noon Session. In keeping with our SMSP Mission ten hours of volunteer service at SMSP per family is required. Regular Sunday Mass attendance is expected.

1ST RECONCILIATION/1ST COMMUNION

This program includes attendance at all FFF Sundays as well as one additional Sunday Parent/Child session per month in preparation for the Sacraments.

TEEN CONFIRMATION

Sacramental Preparation sessions will meet twice a month on Sunday afternoons. Attendance at the Fall Retreat and two Service Retreats are required in addition to regular attendance at Sunday Mass.






