OH MARTHA, MARTHA

Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me."

The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Luke 10



I look forward to summer during the fall, winter and spring! Late winter I begin to anticipate planting and enjoying the "heavenly blue" morning glories in my garden. I remember how peaceful it is to sit in the morning quiet and watch the petals open up as the sun warms them.

The Gospel passage about Jesus visiting with sisters Martha and Mary I imagine for most of us is *very* relatable. It begins with Martha overburdened and complaining to our Lord Jesus. She takes it further by telling him what to do!

His loving response to Martha is simply to choose the better part (as Mary has done).

I relate to Martha, often anxious, and nearly all of it needless. I do complain to our Lord. I regularly share all my feelings with the Lord in prayer. I want to share all that is in my heart and sometimes it can sound more like a litany of complaints. But in holy reverence I am cautious to withhold telling the Lord what to do.

I **long** to model Mary. Mary is peacefully and attentively present to the Lord during His visit.

Growing up as the oldest of six children born close together, I don't recall a ton of time sitting on my parents lap. But in church recently I recalled that safe place as I glanced over to a mother with a pre-schooler cuddled on her lap. That total contentment, that haven where no words are necessary. No needs. Just being.

So with Jesus, now in prayer, I place myself in his lap and just be. I invite the Holy Spirit to help me leave my preoccupations and concerns aside. This time in prayer is so precious. Words are not necessary. I love him and he loves me.

Within the beauty that summer provides, my hope for you is that you, too, will find some time to get away and experience some peaceful prayer. Scripture tells us Jesus words

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled." John 14:27

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION (FFF) AND TEEN CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

Registration has begun for ALL SMSP parish members for our FFF Programs: Pre-K through 7th Grade and Teen Confirmation, which is 8th Grade (High school students are welcome). Parish members whose eldest child will be 3-4 years of age as of Sept. 1, 2019 are eligible for our Pre-K classes.

REGISTRATION FOR NON-PARISH MEMBERS STARTED ON JULY 1, 2019

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

This home-based program requires families to work together at home on lessons. Families meet one Sunday a month at the parish to build community and grow in faith formation and discipleship. We offer three sessions from October thru April: 8AM, 10AM and a Noon Session. In keeping with our SMSP Mission ten hours of volunteer service at SMSP per family is required. Regular Sunday Mass attendance is expected.

1ST RECONCILIATION/1ST COMMUNION

This program includes attendance at all FFF Sundays as well as one additional Sunday Parent/Child session per month in preparation for the Sacraments.

TEEN CONFIRMATION

Sacramental Preparation sessions will meet twice a month on Sunday afternoons. Attendance at the Fall Retreat and two Service Retreats are required in addition to regular attendance at Sunday Mass.
